Low/medium heat nonfat dry milk (NDM) prices moved higher for both ends of the range and mostly price series. Domestic demand is stronger. Demand from international buyers is moderate. Stakeholders indicate loads are widely available for spot purchasing. Manufacturers note steady production schedules. High heat NDM prices moved lower on the bottom end of the range and higher on the top end of the range. Demand is stronger. Some manufactures are running high heat NDM production only upon customer requests for product and price agreements to do so. For manufacturers producing high heat NDM outside of customer requests, seasonally lighter production is moving along steadily.
