COLONY, HONEY PLANT AND MARKET CONDITIONS DURING MARCH 2024

APPALACHIAN DISTRICT (MD, PA, VA, WV): March came in like a lion with plenty of rain, cool temperatures and wind. There were a couple of nice, sunny days sprinkled between the wintry ones. Mid-month brought back the cold with low temperatures in the mid-twenties and highs in the upper forties and low fifties. Beekeepers reported their bees took advantage of the warmer days to clean house, gather pollen, and begin brood rearing. A few beekeepers reported an increase in small hive beetle and were promptly treating their colonies. A few beekeepers were already reporting some early colony losses as well and on the hunt for replacement bees. By the end of the month, several were reporting seeing flying drones and capped brood and in warmer areas were adding swarm traps to the colonies which is about 2 weeks earlier than normal. Red maples and wild cherries were in full bloom at the start of the month along with dead nettle, pussywillow, alders, and witch hazels. With the push of warmer temperatures, the month ended with forsythia, early peaches, blooming and colonies in full activity.

ALABAMA: Alabama experienced above average temperatures for the first part of the month, but above average precipitation and normal temperatures for the latter half. This resulted in abnormally dry conditions observed in early March dissipating as the month progressed. Spring arrived, accompanied by diverse forage availability – camellias, azaleas, holly, and henbit bloomed throughout the state. As a result, colonies built up quickly, requiring

beekeepers to manage their colonies so as to minimize swarms. Some beekeepers monitored for Varroa in anticipation of the need for a treatment prior to placement of honey supers during peak nectar flow. Beekeepers also prepared to receive packages of bees starting early April.

ARIZONA: The month of March was encouraging for rainfall in many parts of the state. According to the Arizona State Climate Office, the rainfall was about 1.25 inches for the month. This is higher than average of .56 inches for the month-to-date. It was also the 24th wettest March of record. This continues the trend seen in February 2024.

Though many hives have returned to the state, there are some that remain in bordering states (e.g. California) for nut tree and other yearly pollination projects. Beekeepers have begun spring treatments for Varroa mites and other problematic pests to honeybees.

The demand for honey once again remains good throughout most of the state. The increased rainfall over the last few months has aided in bringing many flowering plants to full bloom. Citrus trees and desert bloom are the most prevalent pollen sources. The remaining bee hives should fully return to Arizona in the next month or so.

ARKANSAS: During the month of March temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was above normal across most of the same area. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, most of the state had normal soil moisture. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

CALIFORNIA: No report issued.

FLORIDA: Precipitation was above average in north Florida and below average in south Florida for the month. Temperatures were above average in all areas for the month. Bee health was also above average for all areas with some reporting in the north the bees looked the best they had in the past three years. Sources of pollen were plentiful in all areas too with bees being very active. North Florida rains replenished the swamps and river water levels with tupelo reportedly looking good and expected to begin budding in early April. Pollen sources in the north included Tai-Tai, highbush gallberry, poplar, and crimson clover. Most honey produced during the month is expected to be pulled in early April.

Central and South Florida sources of pollen included saw palmetto, Spanish Needle and other assorted wildflowers, black mangrove, and cherry laurels. Orange trees were also blooming but honey production appeared to be below average in Central Florida as citrus acres continue to drop. Some bees were also pollinating cantaloupes and watermelons during March in Georgia and Florida. Palmetto and gallberry are expected to begin blooming in central and south Florida in mid to late April and in north Florida in May. Demand was good for any stored honey at the end of the month with stored supplies being very light.

GEORGIA: Beekeepers are moving honey at a nice pace, and many are out of honey or running low. Weather is good and blooms are coming in as no freeze has taken its toll this year. The hives are ready to be moved up north and the Sourwood should be in good shape for a nice crop.

Prices are strong and Sourwood is bringing \$10 a pound and online it is quoted as \$18 per pound.

IDAHO, COLORADO, UTAH: During the month of March temperatures were average in Idaho. Precipitation in Idaho was above normal. Utah had temperatures that were average and precipitation that was average. Colorado had normal temperatures across the whole state, Precipitation for Colorado was above average for March.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in March Southern Idaho had no drought and Northern Idaho had moderate to severe drought. Utah is currently under no drought to abnormally dry conditions in Southeast Utah. Colorado had normal soil moisture to severe drought in Southwestern Colorado.

Some producers have brought their hives back from California almond pollination.

Prices for the month of March were between \$2.20 and \$3.20 per pound with a mostly price of \$3.00 for Idaho, Colorado prices are too few producers reporting to determine a market. Prices for locally sourced honey in Utah are \$2.50-\$3.30 per pound with mostly \$3.00 to \$3.30.

ILLINOIS: The weather for March has been volatile with changes from warm to cold days with above average amounts of precipitation. Most beekeepers report their bees in good condition. Beekeepers are trying to rebuild their populations with purchased packages. Beekeepers continue to feed their bees, since there is not enough foliage to maintain the bees alone. The bees are feeding on Maple, Willow and dandelions. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and demand was fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

INDIANA: The weather has been good for March with warm temperatures and less than average amounts of rain. Most beekeepers report that some of their bees have survived the winter in good condition, while many report some dead hives. Beekeepers say that they have bought new packages to rebuild their hives. Beekeepers say that the bees are drawing nectar from dandelions and other wildflowers. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

IOWA, KANSAS, MISSOURI, NEBRASKA: No report issued.

KENTUCKY: The beekeeping summary for March in Kentucky was that overall, beekeepers are optimistic about strong honey sales and many beekeeping schools designed to help beginners learn best management practices were organized.

Compared to other years, March weather was mild, so the fields were purple with nettle and henbit and orchards (pears, especially) and crabapples were blooming through the Easter holidays. Kentucky missed its sharp bite of a late-winter snow in March, and so beekeepers were doing their best to prevent swarms, not always successfully. People were catching swarms as early as March 23. Honey sales were strong throughout March.

LOUISIANA: During the month of March temperatures were slightly above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was about normal. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, normal soil moisture conditions exist across most of the state. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

MICHIGAN: March started off warm and dry in Michigan's Upper Peninsula. Good news for the bees! It is not that common in the U.P. to have multiple days to check on and add food to the hives. Many beekeepers were reporting bees returning to the hives loaded with pollen. The extremely dry and warm weather had most of the U.P. on high alert for fires. Once the middle of the month arrived, so did normal winter conditions. Cold, wet and

windy, just what every beekeeper dreads when bees are at their most vulnerable. This weather stuck around throughout the end of the month. Just to add to the joy of beekeeping in the U.P. the bears are once again out of their dens. Wildflower honey retails for \$9.00 per pound.

MINNESOTA: During the month of March temperatures were average across the whole state. Precipitation for March was normal for the North end of the state, the South end of the state saw above normal precipitation.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in March the whole state had abnormally dry to moderate dry soil moisture with a small spot of severe drought up north.

Prices per pound in Minnesota were \$2.80-\$3.00 with mostly price of \$2.80-\$3.00 for locally sourced honey for the month of March.

MISSISSIPPI: The bees are doing well with the nice weather and good blooms from all the vegetation and trees. Privet hedge will be coming in soon and beekeepers are looking forward to a nice crop this year if the weather holds up like it has so far. Prices are strong and higher at \$1.89-2.30 per pound

MONTANA: No report issued.

NEW ENGLAND: No report issued.

NEW YORK: This has been the warmest winter on record; many trees (including maple, alder, willow) and plants have bloomed early, providing a pollen/protein source for stronger brooding colonies. There are frequent flying days, but some nighttime temperatures are frigid. Beekeepers keeping up with increased feed requirements of colonies. Preparations are underway for beekeepers to situate early nucleus hives, packages, and making splits using southern/western queens. The northwest counties continue to be abnormally dry, with some at moderate drought conditions. Honey demand remains strong with some slight price increases.

NORTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

NORTH & SOUTH DAKOTA: Some hives began to make their way home. By mid-March the 2024 California almond bloom is winding down. Weather was mixed with precipitation and wind in some locations hampered bee activity later in the bloom period. As the month went on many beekeepers had already started to move hives out of orchards. later in the month beekeepers had removed their hives from the orchards and headed home or move up the coast to their next crops, such as the pacific Northwest fruit crops.

NASS released their production numbers for last year and the overall colony count was up slightly from 705,000 in 2022 to 723,000 in 2023 (mostly in South Dakota). The Dakotas had 29% of the nation's 2,509,000 colonies. Yields were up from 99 in 2022 to 162 lbs. per colony in 2023, nearly three times the national average. Total production in the Dakotas was set at 49,644,000 lbs., well above the 38,415,000 lbs. in 2022. This represents 39% of the US total 126,744,000 lbs. The increased volume resulted in a decrease in returns from \$2.59 in 2022 to \$1.90 in 2023.

OHIO: March weather in Ohio was extremely active during March. Ohio had 10 tornados, three people were killed. We had several that came very close to bee yards in different counties. Tornados reaching a level of EF3 devastated communities in Logan, Huron and Mercer County as well as five other counties. Several beekeepers reported damage to their apiaries and buildings. One was At Wright-Patterson Air Force Base near Dayton, Ohio. One of the tornados came down at the Ohio State University Farm Science Review Causing major damage to several large buildings.

In March Ohio weather has been warmer than usual, trees and flowers bloomed about two weeks earlier than usual. Feral honeybee colonies are very strong. The winter losses for our feral colonies are about 5%. The winter losses for the commercial bees that are brought into Ohio for beginning Beekeepers is at 50%. Varroa cause major damage to colonies, plus research is showing that commercial queens mating with drones with poor health and unhealthy sperm is causing major queen issues. Honey prices have remained stable at \$5.50 -\$6.00 per pound wholesale, \$9.00 - \$16.00 retail.

Along with the high winds, most of Ohio received snow and rain. Cleveland received 10 inches of snow within a few days along with 3 inches of rain. Temperatures ranged from 75 F early in the month to 23 degrees toward the end of the month. Both Columbus and Cincinnati experienced similar temperature ranges, however Central Ohio received 4 inches of snow and 3.62 inches of rain. Although no snow reached Cincinnati, it received 4.16" of rain. Growing degree days are around 158 in Central Ohio with the saucer magnolia and Sargent Cherry in first bloom. In Cincinnati, the Spring Snow crabapple, Manchu cherry and serviceberry are in first bloom. The corneliancherry dogwood and Manchu cherry are in first bloom in the Cleveland area. Beekeepers are reporting multiple colored pollen being brought in. Drones have emerged and are flying into colonies.

OKLAHOMA: During the month of March temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was slightly below normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Oklahoma had mostly normal soil moisture across most of the state with an abnormally dry area across the Southeast part of the state. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

OREGON: No report issued.

SOUTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

TENNESSEE: Tennessee bees are building up rapidly this spring. The main nectar and pollen sources for March were Redbud, Elm and wildflowers. Swarms have been reported across the state during March.

TEXAS: During the month of March temperatures were slightly above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was about normal across most of the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, North, South and East Texas had normal soil moisture. West Texas was abnormally dry to severe with an area of moderate to extreme drought in an area West of San Antonio.

Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

WASHINGTON: Increased snowfall helped the snowpack, but the total moisture content is still low. The outlook is for some irrigation shortages later in the season.

Some crops began their bloom a bit early and were hit by some more cold temps. As the month came to a close warmer temperatures helped crops begin to advance slowly. While the apple and pear growers were prepping for the full bloom come in April, some crops started in late March. Yakima

County saw honeybees moved into stone fruit orchards. Apricots were blooming along with some bloom showing in cherries and peach blocks in warmer areas.

NASS released their production numbers for last year and the overall colony count was 83,000 in 2023, just under the 86,000 in 2022. Yields were also down slightly from 32 to 27 lbs. per colony. Production in Washington totaled 2,241,000 lbs., down from the 2,752,000 lbs. in 2022. Despite the decreased volume returns dropped from \$3.18 in 2022 to \$2.71 in 2023.

WISCONSIN: The weather for has been mild overall with temperatures fluctuating throughout the month and lots of rain. During warmer days, the bees took cleansing flights. Beekeepers have been checking on the bees to see how they are doing. Most beekeepers report that most of their bees have survived the winter in good condition. Beekeepers also report that their bees are feeding on Daphnes, maple and willow, winter aconite, snow drops, and boxwood as they bring nectar back to the hives. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.
