COMMERCIAL ITEM DESCRIPTION

MEAT LOAF, FROZEN

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has authorized the use of this Commercial Item Description (CID).

1. SCOPE. This CID covers frozen meat loaf, (meat loaf), packed in commercially acceptable containers, suitable for use by Federal, State, local governments, and other interested parties.

2. PURCHASER NOTES. Purchasers *shall specify* the following:

- Type(s), style(s), and topping(s) of meat loaf desired (Sec. 3).
- When analytical requirements are different than specified (Sec. 7.1).
- When analytical requirements need to be verified (Sec. 7.2).
- Manufacturer's/distributor's certification (Sec. 10.1) or USDA certification (Sec. 10.2).

3. CLASSIFICATION. The meat loaf shall conform to the following list which shall be specified in the solicitation, contract, or purchase order.

Types, styles, and toppings.¹

Type I-BeefType II-Beef and pork

Style A - Sliced Style B - Not sliced

Topping 1 - Brown gravy

- **Topping 2** Ketchup
- **Topping 3** No topping
- **Topping 4** Other (as specified by the purchaser)

4. MANUFACTURER'S/DISTRIBUTOR'S NOTES. Manufacturer's/distributor's products *shall meet* the requirements of the:

- Processing guidelines (Sec. 5).
- Salient characteristics (Sec. 6).
- Analytical requirements: as specified by the purchaser (Sec. 7).
- Manufacturer's/distributor's product assurance (Sec. 8).
- Regulatory requirements (Sec. 9).
- Quality assurance provisions: as specified by the purchaser (Sec. 10).
- Packaging requirements other than commercial: as specified by the purchaser (Sec. 11).

5. PROCESSING GUIDELINES.

5.1. <u>**Processing.**</u> The meat loaf shall be processed in accordance with Current Good Manufacturing Practices (21 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 110).

5.2. <u>Food security</u>. The meat loaf shall be processed and transported in accordance with the Food and Drug Administration's (FDA's) *Guidance for Industry: Food Producers, Processors, and Transporters: Food Security Preventive Measures Guidance.*² This guidance identifies the kinds of preventive measures food manufacturers, processors, or handlers may take to minimize the risk that food under their control will be subject to tampering or other malicious, criminal, or terrorist actions. The implementation of enhanced food security preventive measures provides for the security of a plant's production processes and includes the storage and transportation of pre-production raw materials, other ingredients, and postproduction finished product.

5.3. <u>Age requirement</u>. Unless otherwise specified in the solicitation, contract, or purchase order, the meat loaf shall be manufactured not more than 90 days prior to delivery.

6. SALIENT CHARACTERISTICS.

6.1. <u>Ingredients</u>. The meat loaf shall consist of meat, topping (except when topping 3 is specified), spices, and safe and suitable sweeteners and thickeners. All ingredients shall be declared by their common or usual name in descending order of predominance by weight (21 CFR § 101.4(a)) unless exempted by 21 CFR § 101.100.

6.1.1. <u>Meat</u>. The meat shall be beef or pork and shall conform to the applicable provisions of the meat and poultry products inspection and certification requirements (9 CFR Parts 301 to 350). The meat shall comply with all applicable provisions of the Institutional Meat Purchase Specifications (IMPS), including the Acceptable Quality Levels (AQLs) for major and minor defects, the defect levels specified in Table 100I (for beef), and the defect levels specified in Table 400K (for pork) of the IMPS Quality Assurance Provisions (QAPs). The meat loaf shall meet the requirements of the USDA Food Standards and Labeling Policy Book for meat loaf.

6.1.2. <u>Meat loaf mixture</u>. The meat loaf mixture shall contain ground beef or ground beef and pork, ketchup, bread crumbs or rolled oats, spices, seasonings, and may contain vegetables (such as, but not limited to, onions and tomatoes).

6.1.3. <u>Topping</u>. When Topping 1, brown gravy, is specified in the solicitation, contract, or purchase order, the gravy shall contain beef products (e.g., beef base, rendered beef fat, and beef stock), sweeteners, thickeners, and spices, including salt and garlic. When topping 2, ketchup, is specified in the solicitation, contract, or purchase order, the ketchup shall contain tomato paste, vinegar, and spices.

6.1.4. <u>Additional ingredients</u>. The meat loaf may contain food ingredients permitted by the FDA for thickening, emulsifying, stabilizing, preserving, or enhancing flavor. Food additives or generally recognized as safe (GRAS) substances shall be of Food Chemicals Codex Purity or US Pharmacopeia-National Formulary quality and meet the related FDA regulations on food additives or GRAS requirements. Any additional ingredients added directly to the meat components shall comply with the Food Ingredients and Sources of Radiation section of the Regulatory Requirements Under the Federal Meat Inspection Act and the Poultry Products Inspection Act (9 CFR § 424.21), or Safe and Suitable Ingredients Used in the Production of Meat, Poultry, and Egg Products (FSIS Directive 7120.1³).

6.1.5. <u>Foreign material</u>. All ingredients shall be clean, sound, wholesome, and free from foreign material such as plastic pieces, evidence of rodent or insect infestation, and metal contaminants, including, but not limited to, ferrous, non-ferrous, and stainless steel. All tomato products shall comply with the defect action levels specified in the FDA Defect Levels Handbook currently in effect on the date of the solicitation, contract, or purchase order.

6.2. <u>Finished product</u>. The finished meat loaf shall show no evidence of spoilage, thawing and refreezing, or excessive heating (materially scorched).

6.2.1. <u>Appearance</u>. The overall appearance of the meat loaf shall not be dry or mushy. There shall be no foreign color to the product.

6.2.2. <u>Aroma and flavor</u>. The meat loaf with Topping 1 shall have an aroma and flavor characteristic of prepared meat loaf with brown gravy. The meat loaf with Topping 2 shall have an aroma and flavor characteristic of prepared meat loaf with ketchup. There shall be no foreign odors or flavors such as, but not limited to, burnt, scorched, stale, rancid, or moldy.

6.2.3. <u>**Texture and consistency.**</u> The texture of the meat loaf shall not be rubbery or tough. The toppings shall not be excessively thin, thick, or pasty.

7. ANALYTICAL REQUIREMENTS.

7.1. <u>Analytical Requirements</u>. Unless otherwise specified in the solicitation, contract, or purchase order, the meat loaf shall comply with the following ranges and tolerances:

<u>Test</u>	Tolerance
Monosodium glutamate (MSG)	Less than 2.27g per 227 g (8 oz) (1 percent) of finished product
Fat	Less than 23.0 g per 227 g (8 oz) of finished product
Sodium	Less than 1,190 mg per 227 g (8 oz) of finished product
Standard Plate Count	Less than 50,000 CFU per g
Escherichia coli	Less than 3 per g using Most Probable Number
(E. coli)	(MPN) or less than 10 Colony Forming Units (CFU) per g
<i>E. coli</i> O157:H7	Shall be negative
Listeria monocytogenes (L. monocytogenes)	Shall be negative
Salmonella	Shall be negative

7.2. <u>Product verification sampling</u>. When USDA verification of analytical requirements is specified in the solicitation, contract, or purchase order, analytical testing shall be performed on a composite sample. The composite sample shall be 1.134 kg (2.5 lbs) per lot, prepared from a minimum of sixty representative subsamples or retail packages randomly selected from the lot.

7.3. <u>Analytical testing</u>. When specified in the solicitation, contract, or purchase order, the analyses shall be made in accordance with the following methods from the AOAC International Official Methods of Analysis (OMA) or the Bacteriological Analytical Manual (BAM) as specified below:

7.4. <u>**Test results.**</u> Test results for MSG shall be reported to the nearest 0.1 percent. Test results for fat shall be reported to the nearest 0.1 g. Test results for sodium shall be reported to the nearest mg. The test results for standard plate count shall be reported to the nearest 100 CFU per g. The test results for *E. coli* shall be reported to the nearest MPN or CFU. The test results for *E. coli* O157:H7, *L. monocytogenes*, and Salmonella shall be reported as positive or negative. Any result not conforming to the analytical requirements shall be cause for rejection of the lot.

8. MANUFACTURER'S/DISTRIBUTOR'S PRODUCT ASSURANCE. The manufacturer/ distributor shall certify that the meat loaf provided shall meet the salient characteristics of this CID, conform to their own specifications, standards, and quality assurance practices, and be the same meat loaf offered for sale in the commercial market. The purchaser reserves the right to require proof of conformance.

9. REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS. The delivered meat loaf shall comply with all applicable Federal and State mandatory requirements and regulations relating to the preparation, packaging, labeling, storage, distribution, and sale of the meat loaf in the commercial marketplace. Delivered meat loaf shall comply with all applicable provisions of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act, the Fair Packaging and Labeling Act, and regulations promulgated thereunder. When a known allergen is included in the meat loaf, the meat loaf shall comply with the allergen labeling requirements of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act. When the meat loaf is used for the National School Lunch Program, the meat loaf shall comply with all applicable provisions of the Child Nutrition (CN) Programs.

10. QUALITY ASSURANCE PROVISIONS. Purchaser shall specify 10.1 or 10.2.

10.1. <u>Manufacturer's/distributor's certification</u>. When required in the solicitation, contract, or purchase order, the manufacturer/distributor shall certify that the finished meat loaf product distributed meets or exceeds the requirements of this CID.

10.2. <u>USDA certification</u>. When required in the solicitation, contract, or purchase order that product quality, acceptability or both be determined, the Specialty Crops Inspection Division (SCI), Fruit and Vegetable Program (FV), Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS), USDA, shall be the certifying agency. SCI inspectors shall certify the quality and acceptability of the meat loaf in accordance with SCI procedures which include: selecting random samples of the meat loaf, evaluating the samples for conformance with the salient characteristics of this CID and other contractual requirements, and documenting the findings on official SCI score sheets and/or certificates. In addition, when required in the solicitation, contract, or purchase order, SCI will examine the meat loaf for conformance to the U.S. Standards for Condition of Food Containers (7 CFR Part 42) in effect on the date of the solicitation.

PACKAGING. Preservation, packaging, packing, labeling, and case marking shall be commercial unless otherwise specified in the solicitation, contract, or purchase order.
USDA INSPECTION NOTES. When Section 10.2 is specified in the solicitation,

contract, or purchase order, USDA certification shall include evaluation of the quality and condition of samples of meat loaf and compliance with requirements in the following areas:

- Processing guidelines (Sec. 5).
- Salient characteristics (Sec. 6).
- Analytical requirements *when specified in the solicitation, contract, or purchase order* (Sec. 7). When USDA analytical testing is specified, SCI inspection personnel shall select samples and submit them to the USDA, Science and Technology Programs (S&TP) laboratory for analysis.
- Packaging requirements (Sec. 11 or *as specified in the solicitation, contract, or purchase order*).
