

Can I say this on my website? 'Caution: Although Humic Acids have been scientifically proven to be effective against Viruses, Gram negative bacteria, and promote growth in animals, it has not been verified by the Department of Agriculture and the rules are not clear. If you apply Humic Acids to your growing corn crop as a topical supplement to the corn, then you can claim organic. If you apply this product to your corn after it has been harvested, then maybe not. "Naturally Raised Livestock used for the production of meat and meat products have been raised entirely without growth promotants, antibiotics, and have never been fed mammalian or avian byproducts. This information shall be contained on any label claim that an animal has been naturally raised."

We do not regulate what you say on your website. However, the NOP regulations permit the use of humic acids (naturally occurring deposits, water and alkali extracts only) as plant and soil amendments for certified organic crop operations. Therefore, crops raised on land with humic acids applied may be organic, regardless of your statement.
