## QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

A candidate must:

- ✓ be a U.S. citizen or native of a country which owes permanent allegiance to the United States;
- ✓ have completed a 4-year course of study, from an accredited college or university, leading to a bachelor's degree, or;
- ✓ have 3 years of progressively responsible experience, equivalent in the level of difficulty and responsibility to the GS-4 level of Federal service;
- ✓ be able to analyze problems to identify significant factors, gather pertinent data, and recognize solutions;
- ✓ be able to plan and organize work;
- ✓ be able to communicate effectively orally and in writing;
- ✓ be able to operate a motor vehicle and have a valid drivers license at the time of appointment;
- ✓ pass a sensory evaluation test within the first 3 weeks of employment (Failing this test could result in termination of employment.);
- ✓ sign a geographic mobility understanding.
