





Sources of Milk for Federal Order Markets by State and County



PREFACE

This publication presents information relating to the milk supply areas for handlers regulated under Federal milk marketing orders. These orders are established under the authority of the Agricultural Marketing Agreement Act of 1937. While the distribution areas, which determine where fluid milk processors are regulated, are defined specifically by the Federal orders, the milk supply areas are not specified by the orders. It is hoped that this report will provide a meaningful picture of the milk supply areas of Federal milk order markets.

This information in this report is based on a survey of producer deliveries of milk under Federal milk marketing orders during May 2003. Specifically, producer deliveries of milk were examined to determine the State and counties from which these deliveries originated—the county in which the dairy farmer is located. The data were obtained from the milk handlers regulated under the 11 milk marketing orders. The data were collected by Market Administrator's and then submitted to the Kansas City, Kansas Market Administrator's office for compilation. The Kansas City office and the Market Information Branch of Dairy Programs developed the tabular information included in this report. The map in Appendix B was developed by the Kansas City office. All text was written by the Market Information Branch in Washington, DC.

This is the sixteenth report in a series. Similar data have been published for 1957, 1960, 1963, 1965, 1967, 1969, 1972, 1973, 1974, 1976, 1981, 1987, 1988, 1995, and 1997.



FEDERAL MILK MARKETING ORDER AREAS


