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HIGHLIGHTS:

For the week wheat closed mostly higher due to reports of firm basis. Kansas City saw gains as news of Iraq tendering HRWW triggered the market. Weekly crop ratings for winter wheat came in at 78 percent which were unchanged from last week. Corn was mixed finding some support from the higher soybeans. Soybeans saw moderate gains due to news of Asia rust in Louisiana. This is the first case ever reported in the U.S. Corn weekly crop ratings were reported at 76 percent harvested. Soybeans came in at 87 percent harvested. A cold front swept through the Midwest, along with rain halting some combines. However, other areas of the corn-belt did not receive moisture and were able to continue with harvest. The weekly export sales were not released Thursday due to Veterans Day. Wheat was 4-11 cents higher except Minneapolis 22-27 cents lower. Corn was 2 cents lower to 11 cents higher. Sorghum was 2 cents lower to 8 cents higher. Soybeans were 3-14 cents higher.

WHEAT:

Kansas City US No 1 Hard Red Winter, ordinary protein rail bid was 4 1/2 to 6 1/2 cents higher from 4.01 3/4-4.36 3/4 per bushel. Kansas City US No 2 Soft Red Winter rail bid was 4 1/2 cents higher from 3.86 3/4-4.11 3/4 per bushel. St. Louis truck US No 2 Soft Red Winter terminal bid was 11 cents higher from 3.39-3.68 per bushel. Minneapolis and Duluth US No 1 Dark Northern Spring, 14.0 to 14.5 percent protein rail, was 22 to 27 cents lower from 4.67 3/4-4.87 3/4 per bushel. Portland US Soft White Wheat rail was 6 to 8 cents higher from 3.94-3.96 per bushel.

CORN:

Kansas City US No 2 rail White Corn was steady from 1.93-1.98 per bushel. US No 2 truck Yellow Corn was 4 cents higher at 1.77 per bushel. Omaha US No 2 truck Yellow Corn was steady at 1.62 per bushel. Chicago US No 2 Yellow Corn was 1/4 cent lower to 8 3/4 cents higher from 1.72 1/4-1.90 1/4 per bushel. Toledo US No 2 rail Yellow corn was 1 1/4 to 2 1/4 cents lower from 1.68 1/4-1.71 1/4 per bushel. Minneapolis US No 2 Yellow Corn rail was 11 3/4 cents higher at 1.76 1/4 per bushel.

OATS AND BARLEY:

US 2 or Better oats, rail bid to arrive at Minneapolis was 3 to 5 cents higher from 1.61 3/4-1.65 3/4 per bushel. US No 3 or better truck Malting Barley, 70 percent or better plump out of Minneapolis was steady at 2.40. Portland US 2 Barley, unit trains and Barges-export was 5 to 25 cents higher from 4.50-4.75 per cwt.

SORGHUM:

US No 2 yellow truck, Kansas City was 8 cents higher at 3.16 per cwt. Texas High Plains US No 2 yellow sorghum (prices paid or bid to the farmer, fob elevator) was 2 cents lower to 5 cents higher from 3.09-3.34 per cwt.

OILSEEDS:

Minneapolis Yellow truck soybeans were 9 1/2 cents higher at 5.04 3/4 per bushel. Illinois Processors US No 1 Yellow truck Soybeans were 3 1/2 to 6 1/2 cents higher from 5.12 3/4-5.19 3/4 per bushel. Kansas City US No 2 Yellow truck soybeans were 14 cents higher at 5.05 per bushel. Decatur 48 percent Soybean meal, processor rail bid was 2.00 lower to 1.00 higher from 147.00-152.00 per ton. Decatur crude Soybean oil processor bid was 36 to 51 points higher from 22.39-22.74 cents per pound. Sunflower Crude Oil has no comparison at 34.45 per pound.
