Dear Ms. Stommes:

I have the right as a citizen of the U.S. to choose and to control the kind of food I eat. I demand and expect to be able to purchase foods which I KNOW are free of toxic chemicals, foreign genes, pesticides, and herbicides. This means that the label "ORGANIC" must not be made meaningless by the standards and criteria for this label set forth in the proposed National Organic Rule published for public review on December 16, 1979.

I find the labeling as "organic" of foods produced with the use of Genetically Modified Organisms (GMOs), municipal sludge (for fertilizer), or irradiation totally unacceptable.

I am requesting that the recommendations of the organic farmers on the National Organic Standards Board be followed, which would protect my right to safe and healthful food.
