

NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Majority prices were higher in the West, unchanged in the East and Midwest. Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm in the West, generally steady elsewhere. Retail demand was mostly moderate. Food service was mixed and ranged slow to fairly good. Supplies of smaller sizes were in good balance and well cleared; heavier sizes were more than sufficient. In the parts structure, boneless skinless breasts and wings were readily available and competitively priced to stimulate interest. Bone-in breasts were at least adequate to fully adequate. Dark meat items were adequate. Trading was slow to fair. In production areas, live supplies were moderate. Weights were desirable to heavy, mostly desirable.

MIDWEST REGION BROILER/FRYERS The preliminary majority prices for next week's trading into the Chicago area were unchanged from last Tuesday's final. Whole broiler/fryer trade sentiment was steady. Additional product offerings were adequate or available with some discounting noted to stimulate buyer interest. Weather patterns continue cool and damp in much of the region, causing buyer interest to remain cautious and selective. Demand into retail and food service accounts was spotty and irregular, mostly moderate. Floor stocks were well cleared to somewhat long. Weights were in a desirable range. Trading on parts items was slow to moderate overall with discounts noted on boneless/skinless breasts and wings to help clear. Dark meat items were clearing at a moderate level. Supplies of white meat items were better balanced than previous days, except supplies of wings continue to build and drumsticks remain tight. The trade sentiment was barely steady to weak on wings and boneless/skinless breasts, and steady on all other items.

SOUTHERN REGION BROILER/FRYERS Trade sentiment was generally steady. Demand was fair to moderate entering the weekend. Supplies were sufficient for current trade requirements. In the parts structure, boneless skinless breasts were readily available and slow in clearing. Bone-in breast and wings were fully adequate for the mostly light demand. Movement ranged slow to fair. In production areas, live supplies were moderate. Weights were desirable to heavy, mostly desirable.

WESTERN REGION BROILER/FRYERS The market tone was fully steady to firm. Trading reported for next week's deliveries, on regular commitments, were at prices mainly 1 cent higher. Trading reported on new negotiations at unchanged to higher prices. Offerings adequate overall. Buyers interest was moderate to fairly good and centered on current needs. Retailer demand moderate to good, best to cover first-of-the-month needs. Dealers anticipated satisfactory weekend clearances. Ads noted: Southern California - whole body 59-89, boneless breasts 198-458, boneless thigh meat 169-199, boneless leg meat 119-138, split breasts 179 (IQF - 4# 599 and 3.5# 347), leg quarters 10# bags 290-370, thighs or drumsticks 69-149 (IQF - 4# bag 276); Northern California - whole body 69-89, whole cut-up 129, boneless breasts 299, split breasts 139, drumsticks or thighs 139, leg quarters 89 (10# bag 699), (IQF 4# - breasts tenders 999, party wings 599, drumsticks or thighs 299, boneless breasts 899, split breasts 549, boneless thighs 499, 3# - breasts tenders 899); Denver - whole body 89, leg quarters 10# bag 490, boneless breasts 189, (IQF 4# - party wings 396, boneless breasts 716); Arizona - whole body 79, whole cut-up 99, boneless breasts 188-299, split breasts 139-239, leg quarters 79-99 (10# bag 390), thighs or drumsticks 99-119.

NORTHEAST REGION BROILER/FRYERS Trucklot buying activity on ready-to-cook whole broiler/fryers increased slightly entering the weekend was but was generally moderate at best. Offerings of the 3 pound and lighter birds remained in good balance. The 3.5 pound and larger sizes ranged at least adequate to available with the heavier sizes in the longest position. Movement into retail and distributive channels was about fair. The market tone was generally steady. In the parts complex, boneless-skinless breasts were ample and discounted. Bone-in breasts were available. Drums and legs were clearing well. Wings were fully sufficient.

DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was about moderate and centered mainly on the adequate to closely cleared supply of 3.0 pound and smaller sizes. Larger sizes, particularly 4.0 pound and heavier weights were readily available. Live supplies were at least moderate; weights were often heavier than desired. Processing schedules were very heavy when coupled with operations planned for Saturday. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 56 to 70 cents. Trade sentiment was steady. Boneless skinless breasts were in heavy supply; bone-in were fully adequate. Wings were ample. Leg cuts varied from balanced to fully adequate.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER PARTS Trucklot buying interest increased slightly entering the weekend but was mostly fair to moderate overall. Offerings of boneless skinless breasts were readily available at sharp discounts. Bone-in breasts were fully adequate. Drums and legs were clearing well. Wings were fully adequate to available. Movement through retail and distributive channels was only fair at best. The market tone continued steady to fully steady on dark meat cuts, barely steady to weak on wings and breast items.
