

NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE

Majority prices for next week's trading was unchanged to higher. Trade sentiment was steady in the West, fully steady to firm elsewhere. Demand entering the extended Memorial Day weekend was moderate to good with orders increased for holiday needs and retail ads active. Supplies of smaller sizes close to tight and held with confidence, heavier weights readily available. Delivery problems were still present due to truck shortages. Processing schedules were mixed with some plants running Saturday and down Monday to observe holiday. In the parts structure, trading was brisk to cover weekend needs and for retail features. Breast items were well balanced to tight, and all other parts were at least sufficient or available. In production areas, live supplies were moderate. Weights were desirable to heavy, but mostly desirable.

MIDWEST REGION BROILER/FRYERS Preliminary majority prices for next week deliveries into the Chicago area increased from Monday's final majority. The trade sentiment on whole broiler/fryers was steady to fully steady. Offerings were available on heavy weight birds and limited on lighter weight product. Scheduling and trucking issues are a major concern for buyers. Demand into all channels was mixed, slow to mostly good, with traditional holiday activity anticipated. Floor stocks were adequate in most locations with Chicago noting some well cleared inventories. Sizes desirable. Parts offerings were light with wings and tenderloins in the longest position. Trade sentiment was steady to fully steady on breast items, wings and tenderloins barely steady, balance of items steady.

SOUTHERN REGION BROILER/FRYERS Trade sentiment was at least steady to firm. Demand entering the extended Memorial Day weekend was fair to good with best interest for retail ads and resort areas. Supplies were usually sufficient with smaller sizes in the closest position. Delivery problems continued as truck shortages caused delays into various areas. In the parts structure, breast items were irregular with fronts at least adequate with some discounting, but whole breasts short and clearing. The remaining items were readily available or sufficient with mixed interest. In production areas, live supplies were moderate at mixed, but mostly desirable weights.

WESTERN REGION BROILER/FRYERS The market tone was generally steady on regular commitments with new negotiations trading at mixed levels. Offerings of small sized product tight and confidently held, however heavier weight product easily adequate to cover current needs. Buying interest was fair at best. Retailer demand was fairly good overall. Dealers anticipated satisfactory weekend clearances. Ads noted: Southern California - whole body 59-69, whole cut-up 87, seasoned roaster 98, Cornish hen 99-228, 12 pack Cornish hen 1999-2099, 6 pack Cornish hen 1299, boneless breast 148-399, 4# IQF boneless breast 869-899, split breast 99-139, leg quarter 69-77, seasoned leg quarter 77, 10# bag leg quarter 199, 40# case whole leg 1399, wing 99-119, 40# case wings 2999, 5# IQF party wing 599, thigh 69-99, drumstick 69-99, 5# bag drumstick 335; Northern California - whole body 59, boneless breast 399, split breast 119-199, leg quarter 79-99, thigh 79-99, drumstick 99; Colorado - boneless breast 399, seasoned breast fillets 399, split breast 79-199, leg quarter 39; Arizona - roaster 99-149, Cornish hen 22 ounces 279 each or 2 for 500, chicken ka-bobs 399, boneless breast 239-429, breast tenderloins 239-429, boneless thigh meat 239-429, split breast 99-249, leg quarter 99, 10# bag leg quarter 390-490.

NORTHEAST REGION BROILER/FRYER Trucklot buying interest on ready-to-cook whole broiler/fryers was good entering the long holiday weekend. Offerings of the 3 pound and lighter birds were tight and the larger sizes were in close balance. Movement through retail and distributive channels was seasonally good. The market tone was fully steady to firm. In the parts complex, bone-in breasts were short of full needs. Boneless-skinless breasts were closely cleared. Leg quarters and thighs were better balanced. Wings were available.

DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS Movement or ready-to-cook whole birds was generally good entering the weekend. Offerings were in good balance on the 2.5 to 3.5 pound sizes. Heavier sizes were fully adequate. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights ranged desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were very heavy when combined with some operations planned for Saturday. Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent higher at 57 to 71 cents. Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm. In the parts complex, boneless skinless breasts were in good balance and well cleared. Bone-in breasts were in close balance to short. Leg quarters were at least adequate and wings were fully adequate to ample.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER PARTS Trucklot buying activity was good as dealers assumed product for the long holiday weekend. Offerings of breast items were no more than adequate to tight, with bone-in breasts short of full needs. Thighs and leg quarters were noted as better balanced. Wings were at least sufficient. Movement through distributive channels was good, with planned features continuing to draw heavily into the retail sector. The market tone was fully steady to firm on breast items, fully steady on leg quarters and thighs, and about steady on the balance.

EASTERN LIGHT Prices were unchanged. Demand was light for the fully adequate to ample offerings. Processings schedules for next week were less than normal to normal. Movement of finished product was fair with offerings generally adequate. The undertone was steady.

SOUTH CENTRAL LIGHT LIVE HEN Sales were too few to report prices. Demand was moderate at best for fully adequate offerings of spent leghorn fowl. Finished sales were fair with supplies easily covering needs. Schedules were normal. Trade sentiment was steady at best.

NORTH CENTRAL LIGHT LIVE HEN Prices unchanged. Offers ample for the fair at best demand. Alternate forms of disposition being utilized to remove hens. Schedules for next week reduced due to Memorial Day holiday. Trade sentiment steady.

SOUTHEAST HEAVY LIVE HEN Sales were too few to report prices. Demand was moderate for the mostly fully adequate offerings. Processing schedules were reported as about normal to normal. Finished product supplies were at least sufficient for trade needs. The undertone was steady.

SOUTH CENTRAL HEAVY LIVE HEN Trading was too few to report. Offerings of heavy fowl were at least adequate for a slow demand. Finished sales were mixed, usually no better than moderate, and easily covered by current scheduling. Trade sentiment was about steady.

WEST COAST LIGHT LIVE HEN Plants worked full schedules. Offerings ample.
