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

## NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Majority prices for next week are trending higher. Trade sentiment entering the weekend was firm in the West, steady to firm elsewhere. Retail demand was limited and seasonal to moderate for retail ads and other holiday items. Food service was fair to good with strongest movement going into fast food, catering services, and restaurants. Supplies were balanced to well cleared, often tight and held with confidence. Due to next week's Christmas holiday, processing schedules were part time which may limit availability further. In the parts structure, trading was mixed. Inquiries for wings increased and supplies were balance to closely cleared. Breast items were no more than adequate or available and moving, and dark meat was at least sufficient. In production areas, live supplies were moderate at weights in a full range.

**MIDWEST REGION BROILER/FRYERS** Preliminary majority prices into the Chicago market area increased 5 cents from last Monday's final. The market tone on whole birds was mostly steady to firm. Offers were limited for the light to fair buyer interest. Retail demand was seasonal, light to occasionally moderate with decent activity on holiday items. Food service movement was fair to good with best interest into catering, restaurants, and fast food promotions. Floor stocks were well cleared to adequate. Sizes desirable. In the parts sector, trading was decent on wings and boneless/skinless breasts, light to fair activity on dark meat cuts. Supplies of wings and breast items were snug to available, leg quarters adequate. Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm on wings and boneless/skinless breasts, and steady on all other items.

**SOUTHERN REGION BROILER/FRYERS** Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm. Demand was seasonally fair, but stronger for active retail ads, fast food promotions, and other holiday meat items. Supplies were close to short of full trade needs, and possibly less available next week due to reduced processing schedules for the Christmas holiday. In the parts structure, breast items were in the strongest position with supplies no more than adequate to tight. Wings were mixed, but available, and dark meat was at least adequate. In production areas, live supplies were moderate at mixed, but mostly desirable weights.

**WESTERN REGION BROILER/FRYERS** The market tone was firm with trading reported for next week's deliverers at mainly higher prices. Offerings were tight to adequate. Processors worked reduced slaughter schedules due to the up-coming holiday. Due to limited discounting and interest in traditional holiday items buying activity was limited to current needs. Retailer demand was generally fair to fairly good where features were in progress. Dealers anticipated moderate weekend carryovers. Ads noted (per pound unless otherwise stated): Southern California - whole body 59-99, Cornish hen 169, 99 each and 12 count case 2099, roaster 129, boneless breast 169-299, boneless leg meat 79-99 and 40# case 2998, split breast 99, whole breast 89, leg quarters 10# bag 490 and 40# case 799, wing 79-89, party wing 4# IQF 599, thigh 77-89, drumstick 79-89, 50 pieces drumstick and thigh 1799; Colorado - whole cut-up 99, roaster 99, Cornish hen 2 for 500, boneless breast 299, split breast 197-249, drumstick 99, thigh 99, wing 99; Arizona - Cornish hens 169-199, boneless breast 179 and 3# IQF 699-899, breast tenders 269, drumettes 3# IQF 499-599, boneless thigh meat 249, wing IQF 3# 298 and 4# 599, thigh 69, drumstick 69.

**NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYERS** Trucklot buying activity on ready-to-cook whole broiler/fryers was light to fair as dealers continued to limit purchases to normal commitments. However, offering of whole product from the South was limited. Offerings of 3 pound birds were in good balance, four pound sizes were slightly more available. Retail and distributive movement was seasonally light to fair. The market tone was steady to fully steady. In the parts complex, breast items were reported as adequate to close balance, b/s breasts were at least sufficient, dark meat cuts were fully adequate. Wings were noted as well cleared in some locations. Tenderloins were adequate.

**DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS** Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds remained seasonally light. Seller offerings were adequate to tight and were generally well cleared on the smaller sizes. Live supplies were about moderate; weight were light to heavy and trending lighter. Processor schedules were moderate. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 52 to 63 cents. Trade sentiment was steady to full steady. In the parts complex, inquiry for wings had increased and supplies were irregularly available. Other parts were generally adequate for immediate delivery.

**NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER PARTS** Trucklot buying activity was light entering the weekend. Offerings of breast items were generally adequate. Dark meat cuts were adequate to fully adequate. Wings were reported as clearing at most locations. Tenderloins were in a irregular balance. Retail and distributive draw was only seasonal. However, scattered promotional activity was showing some additional movement. The market tone was fully steady on wings and mostly steady on the balance.

Effective January 3, 2003 the Eastern Region, North Central, and South Central Light Live Type Hen reports will no longer report light live hen prices in cents per pound, generally for slaughter within the next 10 days. The report will reflect producer costs in cents per bird for light type hen removal. The change is in response to requests from egg producers, hen buyers, transporters and processors to reflect current industry hen removal practices.

**EASTERN LIGHT LIVE HEN** Prices were unchanged. Demand was no better than fair and generally unaggressive. Offerings were at least adequate. Processing schedules for next week were less than normal due to the holiday. Movement of finished product was moderate to good and well cleared. The undertone was generally steady.

**NORTH CENTRAL LIGHT LIVE HEN** Prices unchanged. Demand mostly light with offerings adequate to ample. Schedules part-time for next week. Trade sentiment steady.

**SOUTH CENTRAL LIGHT LIVE HEN** Trading levels were too few to report. Demand was light. Offerings from production areas were at least adequate. Schedules were reduced for the upcoming week. Finished sales were seasonally active. Trade sentiment was about steady.

**NATIONAL CANNER FOWL MARKET** Majority prices were unchanged on both light and heavy canners when compared to a week earlier. Demand was in a full range of light to good and trading was very limited. Supplies and offerings were in close balance to short and well cleared. The undertone was at least steady to fully steady.
