## NATIONAL EGG REVIEW



At the beginning of the week prices in most areas were higher on larger sizes and unchanged on mediums. As the week progressed prices in all locations were higher. The market tone was very firm. Retail and food service demand was moderate to very good, best where features were in progress. Supplies were about adequate to very tight and the larger sized eggs were noted as short in California. Nest run breaking stock prices were higher. Offerings were tight to short with demand good. Schedules were full-time to over-time. Floor stocks closely balanced to barely adequate. Trade sentiment was firm. Egg products demand was rated as aggressive with all prices trending higher and offerings tight. Offerings for light type fowl were mostly ample with demand light.

PRICES TO RETAILERS, SALES TO VOLUME BUYERS, USDA GRADE A AND GRADE A, WHITE EGGS IN CARTONS, DELIVERED WAREHOUSE, CENTS PER DOZEN.

**MIDWEST REGIONAL** Prices to producers in IA-MN-WI were higher for large and medium. Other reported prices were unchanged. Trade sentiment was firm. Retail demand was fairly good to very good. Loose egg movement was moderate to good. Supplies were well balanced to very tight. Central states breaking stock prices were higher. Offerings were tight to inadequate with demand good. Schedules full-time to over-time. Floor stocks closely balanced to barely adequate. Trade sentiment firm.

Light type hens were fully adequate for processing needs.

**Broiler/Fryer: Weekly Fryers Available for Marketing**

Based on the preliminary chick placements, the number of fryers available for the marketing during the week ending 13-Sep-03 is estimated at 154.1 million head. This compares to 153.1 million head the previous week and to 158.6 million head the same week a year ago, when the slaughter was 160.9 million head and the composite weighted average price was 56.41 cents per pound.






New York Large Weekly Average Price
