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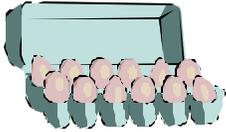

NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Prices remained unchanged. The market tone was steady. Retail demand was mixed in a full range, light to fairly good; with planned promotional activity usually stimulating best interest. Supplies of all sizes continued adequate. Breaking stock offerings were at least adequate, and demand for additional product was generally limited. Light type fowl were adequate for current requirements.

NORTH ATLANTIC Prices were unchanged in all areas. The market tone was steady. Demand was light to at times good, best into retail features in progress or planned for the upcoming week. Supplies were adequate on all sizes. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to fully adequate for the light to moderate demand. Light type fowl were adequate for normal processing schedules.

NEW YORK Prices were unchanged the entire week. The market tone was steady. Demand was light to occasionally good, best into present or planned features. Supplies of all sizes were adequate.

MIDWEST Prices ended the week unchanged in all areas. The trade sentiment was steady. Retail and food service demand was mixed, light to at times good with the best movement coming from current and planned retail features. Supplies were adequate for all sizes. Central States nest run breaking stock prices were unchanged. Trading and demand were quiet as most breakers work from existing inventories. Floor stocks were in balance to adequate. The trade sentiment was about steady to steady.

CHICAGO All prices unchanged. Trade sentiment steady. Retail and food service demand uneven and ranged from light to good, mostly moderate and best where limited features are a factor. Supplies adequate and building in anticipation of the upcoming holiday.

SOUTHERN Prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady. Retail demand was generally fair to moderate entering the weekend, best for the limited feature activity. Supplies of all sizes were adequate. Prices for next week's deliveries were trending unchanged to higher than the current week. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to fully adequate for the light to moderate demand. Light type fowl were sufficient for current processing schedules.

WEST COAST Prices unchanged. The market tone was steady with asking prices for next week unchanged on all sizes throughout the region. Retailer demand improved as early Easter orders increased. Offerings adequate.

NATIONAL LIQUID EGGS Pasteurized whites reported at 34 cents for whole with no pasteurized salt yolk reported. Trade sentiment was steady to mostly steady for whole egg and whites and mixed on yolk from about steady to weak. Offerings of whole egg and whites were adequate with demand usually light to instances moderate. Yolk offerings were fully adequate with demand usually quiet. Traders of liquid product were continuing to report a very quiet market. Breaking stock supplies continued closely balanced to adequate for needs. EASTERN REGION FROZEN EGGS Majority prices were unchanged on truck lot trading when compared to last week's values. Demand remain light and usually unaggressive for sufficient offerings. The undertone was mixed but generally steady on whites and whole, and cautious on yolks. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending April 01, 2000 were 5% more than last week, and 6% more than a year ago. Shell egg supplies were usually adequate for needs.

Demand was light to moderate with most traders still unaggressive. Floor stocks were sufficient for full trade needs. The undertone was slightly unsettled on yolks, balance of items were generally steady. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending April 01, 2000 were 2% less than the previous week, and 15% lower than the same week a year ago.

EGG PRODUCTS

Shell eggs broken totaled 138 million dozen during February 2000, up 10 percent from February a year ago. Regional percentage changes were: North Atlantic, up 7; North Central, up 11; South Atlantic, up 7; South Central, up 1; and Western, up 11. February 2000 contained 21 weekdays, one holiday and four Saturdays, compared to 20 weekdays, one holiday and four Saturdays in February 1999. Data presented in this report were compiled from inspection reports of the Food Safety and Inspection Service. The best available data at time of publication was used.

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
