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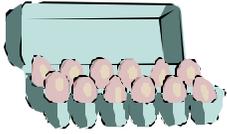

## NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady. Retail demand was mostly light to moderate, with fairly good movement centering around the limited feature activity. Supplies of all sizes were adequate to available, instances ample. Breaking stock offerings were usually adequate for the light to moderate demand. Light type fowl were fully adequate for normal schedules.

**NORTH ATLANTIC** Prices were unchanged in all locations. The market tone was generally steady. Demand was fair to occasionally good, best where features were in progress or planned for next week. Supplies were adequate to available on all sizes. Breaking stock offerings were sufficient for the light to moderate demand. Light type fowl were fully adequate for slaughter requirements.

**NEW YORK** Prices ended the week unchanged. The market tone was generally steady. Demand was fair to good, with traders watching further market developments. Supplies were adequate to available on all sizes.

**MIDWEST** Prices to producers in Iowa-Minnesota-Wisconsin were 2 cents lower for small and were unchanged for large and medium. Prices in other areas were unchanged. The trade sentiment was steady to cautiously steady. Retail demand was fair to instances fairly good. Food service movement was moderate to good, best for resort and vacation areas. Supplies were adequate to available for all sizes. Central States nest run breaking stock prices were unchanged. Offerings were usually adequate and were held with confidence. Demand was light to moderate and most breakers were reluctant to pay higher values for heavy nest runs given current price relationships. Floor stocks were tight to adequate. Schedules were mixed. Trade sentiment was steady.

**CHICAGO** Prices unchanged. Trade sentiment was mostly steady. Demand into retail was light to moderate at best planned or ongoing features. Food service generally moderate. Supplies adequate except jumbo's and smalls somewhat tight.

**SOUTHERN** Prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady. Retail demand was fair to moderate entering the weekend and feature activity was limited. Supplies were generally adequate. Prices for next week's deliveries were trending unchanged to slightly lower than the current week. Breaking stock offerings were sufficient for the light to moderate demand. Light type fowl were fully adequate for immediate needs.

**WEST COAST** Prices unchanged. The market tone was barely steady with asking prices for next week unchanged on jumbo, extra large, and large throughout the region, with medium and small unchanged in the Northwest but 3 cents lower in California. Retailer demand light to only fair. Offerings generally ample.

**EASTERN REGION BREAKING STOCK** Majority prices were unchanged when compared to early week trading. The market tone was steady although some caution was noted for next week. Demand was light to moderate with regular committed offerings sufficient for trade requirements. Undertone was steady. Plants schedules were about normal. Cases broken under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending 10 June 2000 were 10% more than last week, but 9% less than a year ago.

**NATIONAL LIQUID** Pasteurized salt yolk trading reported at 35 cents FOB, with pasteurized whites reported at 29 cents FOB. Trade sentiment was fully steady for whole egg, generally steady for whites, and firm for yolk. Offerings were adequate or available for whites and whole egg and barely adequate to adequate for yolk. Buyers were asking for discounts on liquid whites and meeting some resistance. Demand was mostly moderate as buyers take a wait and see attitude. Breaking stock supplies were tight to adequate.

**EASTERN REGION FROZEN** Majority prices on trucklot trading were unchanged to higher on whole, balance unchanged when compared to last week's values. Demand was fair on whites, moderately active on whole, improved and ranged moderate to good on yolks. Supplies were irregular, but inventories were usually adequate for most immediate trade needs. Overall, the undertone improved and was fully steady on yolks and whole, and usually steady on whites. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending June 10, 2000 were 17% less than last week, and 3% less than a year ago.

**CENTRAL REGION FROZEN** Frozen whole egg, sugar and salt yolk prices ranged higher, with whites unchanged to 1 cent higher. Trade sentiment continued fully steady for whole egg, fully steady to firm on frozen yolk, and steady for whites. Buyer interest was slightly improved in some locations during the period with producers cautious and asking higher values. Offerings were usually adequate for current needs. Breaking stock supplies were tight to closely balanced.

**SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA FROZEN** Prices unchanged. Southern California breaking activity for the week ending 6/10 was 23% more than the previous holiday week. Breaking stock increased to easily cover needs. Frozen demand fair and freezer stocks adequate.

**NATIONAL DRIED** Majority prices were unchanged on albumen, unchanged to higher on blends, and higher on whole and yolks when compared to a week earlier. Trading improved but was not real active as some traders were reluctant to trade for future commitments at current price levels. Offerings were irregular but usually adequate for trade requirements. Monthly dried inventories were higher on plain whole and albumen, but slightly lower on plain yolk. The undertone ranged steady to firm. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending June 10, 2000 were 13% more than the previous week, and 9% higher than the same week a year ago.

**EASTERN LIGHT** Prices were unchanged. Offerings were fully adequate for the light and unaggressive demand. Processing schedules for next week were reported as normal. Finished product was clearing but fully adequate for trade needs. The undertone was generally steady.

**SOUTH CENTRAL LIGHT LIVE HEN** Trading was too few to report. Demand was light for spent leghorn fowl. Finished sales were slow with production schedules fully adequate for needs. Trade sentiment was weak.

**NORTH CENTRAL LIGHT LIVE HEN** Prices remain unchanged. A very limited number of suppliers of spent fowl were receiving the top side of the quoted range. Most processors were working at full capacity with offerings in excess of current needs. Trade sentiment barely steady.

**WEST COAST LIGHT LIVE HEN** Plant schedules generally full. Offerings ample.
