

NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In Chicago, prices were two cents higher for mediums, unchanged on the larger sizes. Elsewhere, prices were unchanged. The market tone was mostly steady to instances firm. Demand continued light to moderate, with fairly good movement noted into weekend promotional activity. Supplies of all sizes were generally adequate to instances barely adequate. Breaking stock offerings were usually sufficient, and demand for additional product was no better than moderate. Light type hens were adequate to fully adequate for processing schedules.

NORTH ATLANTIC Prices were unchanged in all areas. The market tone was steady at best. Demand was light to good and best where feature activity was in progress or planned for next week. Supplies of all sizes were generally adequate. Breaking stock offerings were at least adequate for the fair demand. Light type fowl were fully adequate for the unaggressive demand.

NEW YORK Prices ended the week unchanged. The market tone was steady at best. Demand ranged light to fairly good, best where features were in progress or planned for the upcoming week. Supplies were generally adequate.

MIDWEST Prices to producers in Iowa-Minnesota-Wisconsin were 2 cents higher for mediums and were unchanged for large and small. Prices in other areas remained unchanged. The trade sentiment was steady to fully steady. Retail demand was fair to fairly good, best into planned and ongoing feature activity. Food service movement was generally good, best for vacation and resort areas. Supplies were adequate to instances barely adequate for all sizes. Central states nest run breaking stock prices were unchanged. Offerings were usually adequate to at times tight when compared to earlier in the week. Demand was mostly moderate. Schedules were full-time to over-time. Floor stocks were adequate to instances fully adequate. The trade sentiment was steady.

CHICAGO Prices for mediums advanced 2 cents, balance of sizes unchanged. The trade sentiment generally steady. Retail and food service demand light to moderate, best where features are a factor. Supplies mixed but generally adequate for all sizes.

SOUTHERN Prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady. Retail demand was moderate entering the weekend, with fairly good movement centering around the scattered feature activity. Supplies were adequate on larger eggs, and mediums were usually adequate to instances close. Prices for next week's deliveries were trending unchanged to slightly higher on medium eggs than the current week. Breaking stock offerings of lighter weight eggs continue to be available to plants, and demand was fair but usually unaggressive for any additional product. Light type fowl were adequate to fully adequate for current processing schedules.

WEST COAST Prices were unchanged. Market tone was firm on all sizes. Asking prices in California for next week 1 cent higher on jumbo, extra large and large with mediums and small up 5 cents. Retailer demand fairly good. Offerings in fair balance.

Offerings of lighter weight eggs continue to be available to breaking plants. Demand was fair but usually unaggressive for any additional supplies. The market tone was mixed, but generally steady, with traders closely watching further market developments. Cases broken under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending July 08, 2000 were 13 % less than last week, and 13 % less than a year earlier.

NATIONAL LIQUID No pasteurized whites reported with pasteurized salt yolk trading from 34 to 36 cents fob. Trade sentiment was mostly steady for whole egg and whites and steady for yolk. Demand was mostly moderate to occasionally good with slight discounts helping to generate additional business. Offerings were adequate for needs. Most producers of yolk continue to hold with confidence and use product internally. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to instances fully adequate.

EASTERN REGION FROZEN Prices were generally unchanged when compared to a week earlier. Demand for immediate movement was mostly slow, although some inquiry was developing for future shipments. Supplies were irregular, but mostly fully adequate for trade needs. Undertone was unsettled but some improvement was noted. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending July 08, 2000 were 6% less than last week, but 1% more than a year ago.
