

## NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In the Midwest, prices were higher on mediums. Elsewhere, prices were unchanged. The market tone was generally steady with asking prices for next week's deliveries trending unchanged on larger sizes and higher on lighter weight eggs. Demand remained fair to fairly good and best where features were in progress or planned for next week. Supplies were adequate for the larger sizes but closely balanced on the smaller eggs. In the Midwest, breaking stock offerings were light to adequate for the mixed demand. In the Eastern region, breaking stock supplies were adequate to fully adequate and demand was moderate. Light type fowl were short to about adequate for reduced slaughter needs.

**NORTH ATLANTIC** Prices were unchanged in all locations. The market tone was at least steady. Demand remained fair to fairly good, slightly better where features were in progress or planned for the upcoming week. Supplies were generally adequate. Breaking stock offerings were adequate to fully adequate for normal operating plant schedules. Demand was moderate with trading mostly from regular sources. Light type fowl were short to about adequate for reduced processors needs.

**NEW YORK** Prices were unchanged. The market tone was at least steady. Demand continued fair to fairly good and was somewhat better where features were in progress or planned for next week. Supplies were generally adequate for trading needs.

**MIDWEST** Prices to producers in Iowa-Minnesota-Wisconsin on mediums 1 cent higher, balance unchanged. Prices to retailers in all areas unchanged. Trade sentiment generally steady on larger sizes, steady to instances fully steady on mediums. Retail demand mixed, slow to instances fairly good with some scattered feature activity. Food service movement moderate. Supplies of all sizes adequate to in close balance. Central states breaking stock prices unchanged. Trading and demand mixed for the light to adequate offerings. Company owned production and regular commitments satisfy current breaking needs. Buyers reluctant to purchase additional nest run product at higher prices due to price relationships. Floor stocks adequate to in close balance. Trade sentiment generally steady. Light type hen supplies adequate to fully adequate. Slaughter schedules fulltime. Trade sentiment steady.

**CHICAGO** Prices for mediums increased 1 cent, balance of sizes unchanged. The market tone steady. Retail and food service demand moderate, best for features that are planned are in progress. Supplies generally adequate.

**SOUTHERN** Prices were unchanged. Asking prices for next week's deliveries were generally trending higher than current week. The market tone was steady to instances fully steady. Demand was moderate and best where features were in progress or planned for next week. Supplies were adequate. Breaking stock offerings were adequate to fully adequate for the moderate demand. Light type fowl were short to about adequate for reduced slaughter schedules.

**WEST COAST** Prices unchanged. The market tone was steady on the large sizes, firm on medium with asking prices for next week throughout the region unchanged on jumbo, extra large, and large, 4 cents higher on medium. Retailer demand moderate, best to cover planned features. Offerings adequate.

**NATIONAL LIQUID** Pasteurized salt yolk reported at 58 to 60 cents FOB. No pasteurized whites noted. Trade sentiment steady to firm on liquid whole egg and yolk, steady on liquid whites. Trading and demand moderate to fairly good. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to in close balance. Most breakers running fulltime schedules. Trade sentiment steady on nest run breaking stock.

**EASTERN REGION FROZEN** Mostly prices were unchanged on salt yolk, unchanged to one cent higher on sugar yolks, higher on whole, and unchanged to one cent lower on whites when compared to a week earlier. The market tone was fully steady on yolks, steady on whole, and unsettled on whites. Demand was light with best interest centered on yolks. However, overall movement on products were usually good from previous orders. Supplies were adequate for current needs. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending October 07, 2000 were 4% less than last week, and 12% percent less than a year ago.

**NATIONAL DRIED EGG** Mostly prices were unchanged when compared to a week earlier. The market tone was fully steady on yolks, steady to fully steady on whole, and unsettled but slightly steadier on whites at prevailing price levels. Demand was usually light with most inquiry still centering on yolk products. Supplies were about adequate on yolks, adequate on whole, and adequate to available on albumen. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending October 07, 2000 were 3 % more than last week, but 2 % less than the same week a year ago.
