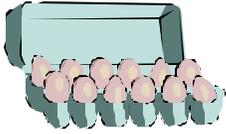

NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Prices remained unchanged in all regions. The market tone was steady. Demand was light to good, mostly light to moderate and was best where were featured. Supplies were adequate. Breaking stock offerings were adequate to available for the very light and unaggressive demand. Light type hens were sufficient for current processing needs.

NORTH ATLANTIC Prices remained unchanged in all areas. The market tone was steady. Demand was light to moderate and best where features were in progress or planned for next week. Supplies were adequate for current needs. In the Philadelphia area, large eggs were advertised for 79 cents per dozen. Breaking stock offerings were adequate from regular sources for the light and unaggressive demand. Light type hens were sufficient for normal processing schedules.

NEW YORK Prices remained unchanged. The market tone was steady. Demand was light to moderate, best where features were planned or in progress. Supplies were adequate for trading needs.

MIDWEST Prices remained unchanged in all areas. The trade sentiment was steady. Retail and food service demand was light to good, with the best interest coming from retail feature activity. Features noted were one dozen jumbo for 69 cents limited to four per customer in Ohio and one dozen large for 39 cents also in Ohio. Supplies were adequate for current needs. Central States nest run breaking stock prices were 1 to 3 cents lower and checks and undergrades were down 5 cents. Offerings were adequate to available for the very light demand. Buyers continue to bid sharply lower prices. Floor stocks were adequate. The trade sentiment was weak. North Central light hens were fully adequate for current needs with prices unchanged.

CHICAGO Prices for all sizes unchanged. The trade sentiment steady. Retail and food service demand mixed, mostly moderate and best where features are planned or in progress. Supplies adequate.

SOUTHERN Prices were unchanged. In Atlanta, asking prices for next week's deliveries were ranging unchanged from current week. However, in Florida, prices for next week were trending higher on all sizes. The market tone was steady. Demand was light to moderate and best where features were in progress or planned for next week. Movement of eggs into retail channels in the Atlanta area was unchanged from a week ago but 33 percent less than the same week last year. Supplies were adequate. Breaking stock supplies were adequate for the light and unaggressive demand. Light type fowl were sufficient for current processing requirements.

WEST COAST Prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady. Asking prices for next week unchanged throughout the region. Retailer demand moderate overall. Offerings were generally adequate.

NATIONAL LIQUID Pasteurized salt yolk reported from 60 to 63 cents fob with no pasteurized whites reported. Trade sentiment mostly steady to instances barely steady for all liquid products. Offerings were becoming more available and were fully adequate. Demand was light to moderate for all liquid products as buyers and sellers watched related shell egg markets. Shell egg supplies were readily available and prices were trending sharply lower.

Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending November 04, 2000 were 1% more than last week, but unchanged from a year ago.
