Supplies were adequate to ample in all areas except California, which had lighter offerings. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to ample and for the light and unaggressive demand. Light type fowl were adequate to fully adequate for the moderate demand.

NORTH ATLANTIC In Boston prices for extra large and large were unchanged to 2 cents lower and unchanged on medium. Elsewhere, prices were unchanged. The market tone was about steady to steady on white eggs and barely steady on brown eggs. Demand continued light entering the weekend, although some improvement was noted. Supplies were adequate to ample on all sizes for current requirements. Breaking stock offerings were adequate to ample for only a fair demand. Light type fowl were adequate to fully adequate for current requirements.

NEW YORK Prices were unchanged. The market tone was about steady to steady on larger sizes, although barely steady on medium. Demand was light to moderate entering the weekend. Supplies were adequate to ample on all sizes.

MIDWEST Producer prices in Iowa-Minnesota-Wisconsin were 2 cents lower on large and medium with small unchanged. The balance of prices in all other locations were unchanged. Trade sentiment was cautiously steady to barely steady. Cartoned and loose egg movement was slow to mostly fair with slight improvement seen as the week closed. Supplies were adequate to available on all sizes. Central States nest run breaking stock prices were unchanged. Demand was light and unaggressive as bids for heavy nest runs continue to decline in value. Offerings were fully adequate to ample. Floor stocks were balanced to adequate. Trade sentiment barely steady to mostly weak.

CHICAGO Prices for all sizes declined 2 cents. Trade sentiment steady to barely steady. Retail and food service demand generally moderate, best where features are a factor. Supplies of all sizes adequate.

SOUTHERN Prices ended the week unchanged. Asking prices for next week's deliveries were trending lower than current week. The market tone was steady to barely steady. Demand was light entering the weekend with promotions providing the best movement. Supplies were generally adequate for trade needs. Breaking stock offerings were adequate to ample for the fair demand. Light type hens were about adequate to sufficient for the moderate demand.

WEST COAST Prices unchanged. The market tone was weak with asking prices for next week 6 cents lower on jumbo, 5 cents lower on extra large and large, 4 cents lower on medium and small in California; 4 cents lower on all sizes in the Northwest. Retailer demand moderate to fairly good. Offerings in close balance inside the region, ample from outside.

January 2001 contained 23 weekdays, 2 holidays and four Saturdays compared to 21 weekdays, 2 holidays and five Saturdays in January 2000.
