## NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Prices ended the week unchanged in all regions. The market tone ranged steady to fully steady, instances firm in California. Demand was light to good, mostly moderate with few features planned for next week. Supplies were adequate to ample in all areas except California, in which offerings were held with more confidence. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to ample for the light demand. Light type fowl were usually sufficient for trade needs.

**NORTH ATLANTIC** Prices ended the week unchanged in all areas. The market tone was steady on white eggs and barely steady on brown eggs. Demand was light to moderate with very limited feature activity planned for upcoming week. Supplies were fully adequate for current requirements with larger sizes slightly more available. Breaking stock demand was light to fair for fully adequate to ample offerings. Light type hens were sufficient for current trade requirements.

**NEW YORK** Prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady entering the weekend. Demand was light to moderate at current price levels. Supplies were fully adequate for trade needs.

**MIDWEST** All prices unchanged. Trade sentiment was steady to instances fully steady. Retail demand was light to moderate, instances good. Food service movement was generally moderate. Overall demand noted as improved and best where promotions are a factor. Supplies were adequate to ample with smaller sizes in the longest position. Central States nest run breaking stock prices unchanged. Offers adequate to instances ample on lighter weight product. Demand quiet as many breakers continue to shorten schedules for next week. Trade sentiment generally steady.

**CHICAGO** Prices for all sizes unchanged. Trade sentiment steady to fully steady. Retail and food service demand uneven and ranges from light to good, mostly moderate and best where specials are a factor. Supplies of all sizes adequate.

**SOUTHERN** Prices ended the week unchanged. In Atlanta, asking prices for next week's deliveries were trending unchanged from current week. However, in Florida, next week's prices were trending lower on all sizes. The market tone was mostly steady. Demand was light and best where promotions were in progress or planned for next week. Supplies were adequate to ample for trade needs. Breaking stock offerings were adequate to ample for the light to fair demand. Light type hens were usually sufficient for processing needs.

**WEST COAST** Prices unchanged. In California large, medium, and small were firm with asking prices for next week 1 cent higher while jumbo and extra large remained steady at unchanged asking prices. In the Northwest the market was steady with asking prices unchanged on all sizes. Retailer demand mainly moderate. Offerings in close balance from all areas and held with much more confidence

**NATIONAL LIQUID** Pasteurized salt yolk reported from 52.5 to 57 cents fob with no pasteurized whites reported. Trade sentiment was steady to barely steady for whole egg, barely steady to mostly weak for whites and fully steady to firm for yolk. Whole egg offerings were about adequate to less available than the previous week with offerings of yolk mostly tight and fully adequate to instances ample for whites. Demand was mostly light for whole egg and whites and moderate to mostly good for yolk. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to mostly fully adequate with prices unchanged.
