CHICAGO Prices for all sizes advanced 3 cents. Trade sentiment steady to firm. Retail and food service demand moderate to good, best where features are a factor. Supplies of all sizes adequate to barely adequate and held with confidence.

SOUTHERN Prices ended the week unchanged. Asking prices for next week's deliveries were trending higher than current week. The market tone was mostly firm entering the weekend. Demand was moderate to occasionally good and best where promotions were in progress or planned for the upcoming week. Supplies were adequate for trade needs. Breaking stock demand was only fair for reduced but usually adequate offerings. Light type fowl were generally sufficient for processing schedules.

WEST COAST Prices unchanged. The market tone was very firm with asking prices for next week 10 cents higher on extra large, large, and medium throughout the region, 6 cents higher on jumbo in California and 8 cents higher on jumbo in the Northwest. Retailer demand moderate. Offerings short of the active demand to build supplies for Easter.

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CHICKENS AND EGGS**FEBRUARY EGG PRODUCTION DOWN 2 PERCENT**

U.S. egg production totaled 6.52 billion during February 2001, down 2 percent from last year. Production included 5.51 billion table eggs and 1.01 billion hatching eggs, of which 947 million were broiler-type and 60.0 million were egg-type. The total number of layers during February 2001 averaged 336 million, up 2 percent from the total average number of layers during February 2000. February egg production per 100 layers was 1,943 eggs, down 4 percent from 2,016 eggs in February 2000.

February 2001 contained 20 weekdays, 1 holidays and four Saturdays, compared to 21 weekdays, 1 holidays and 4 Saturdays in February 2000.

All layers in the U.S. on March 1, 2001, totaled 336 million, up 2 percent from a year ago. The 336 million layers consisted of 276 million layers producing table or commercial type eggs, 56.8 million layers producing broiler-type hatching eggs, and 2.78 million layers producing egg-type hatching eggs. Rate of lay per day on March 1, 2001, averaged 69.5 eggs per 100 layers, down slightly from the 69.8 eggs a year ago.

Laying flocks in the 30 major egg producing States produced 6.11 billion eggs during February 2001, down 2 percent from February 2000. The average number of layers during February, at 315 million, was up 1 percent from a year earlier.
