NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Prices ended the week unchanged. The market tone was steady. Demand was mostly moderate to good, due to upcoming Easter holiday and promotional activity. Supplies were adequate to available. Breaking stock demand was light for adequate offerings. Light type hens were sufficient for a fair demand.

NORTH ATLANTIC All prices were unchanged. The market tone was generally steady. Demand into all channels was moderate to good and increased due to consumer needs for the upcoming Easter holiday. Supplies were adequate to available for current requirements. Breaking stock offerings were usually adequate for the only fair demand. Light type hens were adequate for the fair demand and processing schedules were irregular.

NEW YORK Prices ended the week unchanged. The market tone was generally steady entering the weekend. Demand into all outlets ranged moderate to good and increased due to the Easter holiday. Supplies were adequate to available for trade needs.

MIDWEST Prices ended the week unchanged. The trade sentiment was mostly steady. Retail demand was usually good with the best interest coming from feature activity and Easter sales. Foodservice movement was moderate. Supplies were adequate to available. Central States nest run breaking stock prices ranged unchanged. Demand was light and centered around regular commitments. Additional offerings were adequate for needs. Floor stocks were balanced to adequate. Trade sentiment was steady.

CHICAGO Prices for all sizes unchanged. Trade sentiment steady. Retail and food service demand light to moderate, instances good. Movement for the Easter holiday starting to improve while processors are starting to work extra hours. Supplies adequate for current needs and building for the upcoming holiday.

SOUTHERN Prices ended the week unchanged. Asking prices for next week's deliveries were trending unchanged from current week. The market tone was steady entering the weekend. Demand was mostly moderate to occasionally good, due to the upcoming Easter holiday. Supplies were adequate for trade needs. Breaking stock demand was only fair for usually adequate offerings. Light type fowl were adequate for the fair demand.

WEST COAST Prices unchanged. The market tone was steady with asking prices for next week unchanged on all sizes throughout the region. Retailer demand seasonally good. Easter stocks moving close to expectations with additional offerings adequate.

NATIONAL LIQUID Pasteurized salt yolk reported from 69.5 to 81 cents fob, mostly 69.5 to 72, with pasteurized whites at 24 cents fob. Trade sentiment was steady for whole egg, barely steady to weak on whites, and steady to firm for yolk. Offerings of all liquid egg products were usually adequate for needs with yolk in the tightest position. Demand was generally quiet. Breaking stock supplies were balanced to adequate with prices ranging unchanged. Prices paid cents per lb., FOB Plant to 10:00AM Friday 06 April, 2001 non-pasteurized trucklot. Trading was light to fair mostly light. Offerings of yolks continue to be held with confidence, whole egg were slightly improved and whites were reported as showing increased availability. The undertone was fully steady to firm on yolks, steady on whole, and unsettled on whites. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending March 31, 2001 were 1% less than the previous week, and 3% less than a year ago.

CENTRAL REGION FROZEN Frozen whole egg prices were unchanged with whites unchanged to 1 cent lower and sugar and salt yolk 1 to 2 cents higher. Trade sentiment was steady for whole egg, steady to cautiously steady for whites and firm for yolk. Offerings were adequate for needs with whole egg and yolk suppliers holding product with confidence. Many buyers were seeking long term commitments and meeting continued resistance. Breaking stock supplies were adequate for current schedules.

NATIONAL DRIED EGG Majority prices were unchanged to higher on yolk, with majority values unchanged on other items when compared to a week earlier. The undertone was firm on yolks, steady to fully steady on whole, steady on blends and unsettled to about steady on albumen. Trading was light. Offerings of yolks were limited but where available held with confidence, other product items were usually sufficient for trade needs. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending March 31, 2001 were 3% less than the previous week, and 28% less than the same week a year ago.

Shell Eggs Broken Down 4 Percent

Shell eggs broken totaled 132 million dozen during February 2001, down 4 percent from February a year ago. Regional percentage changes were: North Atlantic, down 12 percent; North Central, down 1; South Atlantic, down 4 percent; South Central, down 17; and Western, down 10.

February 2001 contained 20 weekdays, 1 holiday and four Saturdays compared to 21 weekdays, 1 holiday and four Saturdays in February 2000.

Data presented in this report were compiled from inspection reports of the Food Safety and Inspection Service. The best available data at time of publication were used.
