



# USDA EGG MARKET NEWS REPORT

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## NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In Boston and Chicago, prices were unchanged to lower on all sizes. In other areas, prices were unchanged. The market tone was barely steady to weak entering the weekend. Retail and distributive demand ranged light to moderate. Supplies were fully adequate to ample for current trade requirements. Breaking stock offerings were fully adequate for the light to moderate demand. The undertone was steady to barely steady. Light type hens were ample to burdensome and demand was fair. Processing schedules for next week were irregular.

**NORTH ATLANTIC** In Boston, prices were unchanged to 3 cents lower on all sizes. Elsewhere, prices were unchanged. The market tone was barely steady to weak. Demand was light to moderate. Supplies were fully adequate to available for trade needs. Breaking stock offerings were irregular and usually fully adequate for the light to moderate demand. Light type hens were ample to burdensome and demand was fair. Processing schedules were normal to less than normal for next week.

**NEW YORK** Prices were unchanged on all sizes. The market tone was barely steady to weak. Demand into all channels ranged light to moderate. Supplies were fully adequate to available.

**MIDWEST** Prices to producers in Iowa-Minnesota-Wisconsin were lower. Prices in other areas were unchanged. The trade sentiment was barely steady to mostly weak. Retail and food service demand was light to moderate. Supplies were fully adequate to ample. Central States nest run breaking stock prices were unchanged. Offerings were fully adequate with demand quiet at this call as most breakers worked from balanced to ample, mostly fully adequate inventories. The majority of breakers had scheduled five day work week to cover orders. Trade sentiment steady at the current quoted range.

**CHICAGO** Prices for extra large and large declined 3 cents, mediums dropped 5 cents. The trade sentiment steady to weak. Retail and food service demand was light to moderate. Supplies were fully adequate to ample for all sizes.

**SOUTHERN** Prices were unchanged entering the weekend. The market tone was barely steady to weak. Asking prices in Atlanta for next weeks deliveries were ranging lower on all sizes. In Florida, asking prices for next weeks deliveries were unchanged on smalls and ranging lower on balance. Demand was light. Supplies were adequate to ample at current price levels. Breaking stock supplies were fully adequate for needs and demand was light to moderate. Light type hens were ample to burdensome for irregular processing schedules.

**WEST COAST** Prices unchanged. The market tone was weak with asking prices throughout the region 5 cents lower on jumbo, 6 cents lower on extra large and large, and 9 cents lower on medium. Retailer demand mainly moderate, best where features in progress and planned. Offerings ample.

**NATIONAL LIQUID** Pasteurized salt yolk reported from 64 to 69 cents fob, with pasteurized whites reported at 17.5 cents fob. Trade sentiment was steady at the weighted average for all products. Offerings were adequate on whole egg and whites at the beginning of the week and by the close of the period offerings were reported as tight to short of next week's needs. Demand for whole egg, whites, and pasteurized salt yolk was rated as good, with raw yolk demand fair. Breaking stock supplies were balanced to ample, mostly fully adequate with prices lower.

**EASTERN REGION FROZEN** Prices were unchanged to lower as occasional spot sales were on prevailing market levels. Supplies were limited on yolks, usually adequate on whole, and irregular but improved on white. Demand was light to good with increased orders noted for future deliveries. Trade sentiment was mixed as traders watch further market developments. The overall tone ranged from about steady to steady. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending May 26, 2001 were 5% less than the previous week, and 9% less than a year ago.

**CENTRAL REGION FROZEN** Frozen whole egg and white mostly values were unchanged to 1 cent lower, with sugar and salt yolk 1 to 3 cents lower when compared to last week's reported prices. Trade sentiment was mostly steady for all products. Demand was mostly moderate to instances good. Offerings were closely balanced to adequate, with whole egg and whites in the tightest position.

Breaking stock supplies were in a full range from balanced to ample and building with prices lower when compared to last week.

**NATIONAL DRIED EGG** Mostly prices were unchanged to lower on blends and albumen, but lower on whole and yolks when compared to a week earlier. Demand was light to good best on yolk products. Supplies were usually tight on yolks, sufficient on whole and blends, and at least fully adequate on albumen. Trade sentiment was unsettled on albumen, other items steadier. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending May 26, 2001 were 3% less than the previous week, and 22% less than the same week a year ago.
