



USDA EGG MARKET NEWS REPORT

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NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Prices were lower on all sizes in Chicago. In Boston, prices were lower on the larger sizes, but unchanged on mediums. Otherwise, prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady to barely steady. Demand was mostly light to moderate and was best where features were planned for next week. Supplies were adequate to available for trade needs. Breaking stock offerings were adequate to ample for the light to moderate demand. Light type fowl were fully sufficient to ample for irregular processing schedules.

NORTH ATLANTIC In Boston, prices were unchanged to two cents lower on the larger sizes and unchanged on mediums. In Philadelphia and New England, prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady to barely steady entering the weekend. Demand ranged light to moderate, best where retail features enhanced movement. Supplies were adequate to available. Breaking stock offerings were fully sufficient to ample for the light demand. Light type hens were fully adequate to ample for irregular processing schedules and buyers were unaggressive.

NEW YORK Prices were unchanged on all sizes. The market tone was steady to barely steady entering the weekend. Demand was light to moderate, best where retail items were featured. Supplies were adequate to available for trade requirements.

MIDWEST Prices to producers in Iowa-Minnesota- Wisconsin were lower for large and medium and were unchanged for small. Other reported prices were unchanged. Trade sentiment was steady to barely steady. Retail demand was usually light to at times moderate. Food service movement was usually good. Supplies were fully adequate to available. Central States nest run breaking stock prices were lower. Demand was mostly light to moderate while most breakers plan reduced schedules for next week. Offerings were adequate to available with current bids aimed at lower levels. Floor stocks balanced to adequate. Trade sentiment barely steady.

CHICAGO Prices for all sizes declined 2 cents. The trade sentiment steady. Retail and food service demand in a full range, best where features are a factor. Feature noted on large size eggs buy one at regular price get one free. Buyers cautious due to the upcoming holiday. Supplies generally adequate.

SOUTHERN Prices were unchanged on all sizes. In Atlanta, asking prices for next week's deliveries were trending lower on all sizes. However, asking prices in Florida were trending higher on the larger sizes but lower on mediums. The market tone was barely steady entering the weekend. Demand into all outlets was light to at times moderate and was best where features were planned for next week. Supplies were adequate to available for current needs. Breaking stock offerings were fully adequate to ample for the light demand. Light type hens were fully sufficient to ample for irregular schedules.

WEST COAST Prices unchanged. The market tone was weak with asking prices for next week 2 cents lower on jumbo, extra large, and large throughout the region, 6 cents lower on medium and small in California and 2 cents lower on medium in the Northwest. Retailer demand light to moderate. Offerings easily adequate.

NATIONAL LIQUID Pasteurized salt yolk reported from 68 to 69 cents fob, with no pasteurized whites reported. Trade sentiment was steady to fully steady for whole egg and steady to mostly steady for whites and yolk. Demand for all product this week was rated as good especially with a shortened work week ahead. Offerings were usually adequate for needs with yolk slightly more available than last week, but excess product was readily absorbed by willing buyers. Breaking stock supplies were balanced to adequate with prices lower when compared to last week. Prices paid cents per lb., FOB Plant to 10:00AM Friday 29 June, 2001 non-pasteurized trucklot. Supplies were adequate to fully adequate. Demand was generally reported in a full range of light to good. Trade sentiment was cautious on salt yolk, and usually steady on balance. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending June 23, 2001 were unchanged from the previous week, but 10% less than a year ago. Total year to date change was about 15% less than last year.

NATIONAL DRIED EGG Mostly prices were unchanged on albumen and blends, unchanged to lower on whole and yolks when compared to a week earlier. The undertone was unsettled on albumen, other items were cautious but steady. Demand was moderate with improved forward interest reported. Supplies were fully adequate on albumen, irregular but usually sufficient on balance. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending June 23, 2001 were 7% more than the previous week, but 2% less than the same week a year ago. Total year to date change was about 18% less than a year earlier.
