Supplies adequate or available.

SOUTHERN Prices were unchanged. In Atlanta, asking prices for next week's deliveries were trending lower on the larger sizes and unchanged on mediums. However, next week prices for Florida were generally trending higher than current week. The market tone was steady to barely steady entering the weekend.
