



USDA EGG MARKET NEWS REPORT

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NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Prices ended the week unchanged. The market tone was only about steady entering the holiday weekend. Demand was light to moderate. Supplies were adequate to available for full trade needs. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to fully adequate for the light to moderate demand. Light type hens were fully sufficient for less than normal schedules.

NORTH ATLANTIC Prices ended the week unchanged in all locations. The market tone was about steady entering the long holiday weekend. Demand was light to moderate. Supplies were adequate to available at current price levels. Breaking stock offerings were adequate to fully adequate for a moderate to light demand. Light type hen offerings were fully adequate. Demand was mostly light and unaggressive.

NEW YORK Prices were unchanged on all sizes. The market tone was about steady entering the holiday weekend. Demand ranged light to moderate. Supplies were fully adequate for current trade requirements.

MIDWEST Prices unchanged. Trade sentiment was about steady. Retail demand was mixed, usually light to moderate some retail features generating extra interest. Food service movement was good. Supplies were adequate to ample. Central States nest run breaking stock prices were unchanged. Demand was mostly light to moderate with best interest on heavy nest runs. Offerings of heavy nest runs were more available than previously noted with most breakers satisfied with current inventories and bidding lower values for additional product. Lighter weighted shell eggs were fully adequate for current needs. Schedules full-time or better. Trade sentiment cautiously steady.

CHICAGO Prices on all sizes unchanged. The market tone was steady. Retail and food service demand light to moderate and best where limited features are a factor. Supplies adequate.

SOUTHERN Prices ended the week unchanged. Asking prices for next week's deliveries were trending unchanged from current week. The market tone was about steady entering the holiday weekend. Demand was light to moderate. Supplies were adequate to available for full trade needs. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to fully adequate and demand was light to moderate. Light type fowl were fully sufficient for the mostly light and unaggressive demand.

WEST COAST Prices unchanged. The market tone was steady with asking prices for next week unchanged on all sizes throughout the region. Retailer demand improved slightly to cover the long holiday weekend but was just fair overall. Offerings generally ample with fewer offerings from within the region easily compensated by ready availability from outside.

NATIONAL LIQUID Pasteurized salt yolk reported from 66.5 to 68.5 cents fob, with pasteurized whites reported at 17.5 cents fob. Trade sentiment was steady to fully steady for whole egg, firm for yolk, and steady on whites with processors carefully watching current breaking stock trading levels. Demand continued good to very good for whole egg and yolk and moderate to mostly good for whites. Offerings of whites were adequate with whole egg and yolk tight to short of current needs. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to fully adequate with prices unchanged when compared to last week.

NATIONAL DRIED EGG Mostly prices were unchanged to lower on albumen, balance of other items were mostly unchanged when compared to a week earlier. The undertone was barely steady to steady on albumen, cautious but usually steady on whole, and fully steady on yolks. Trading was moderate to light. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending August 25, 2001 were 8% more than the previous week, and 20% more than the same week a year ago. Year to date total change was 14% less than a year earlier.
