NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In Chicago, prices were higher on all sizes. In most other locations, prices were unchanged. The trade sentiment was steady to fully steady entering the weekend. Demand was usually moderate and was best where features were planned for next week. Supplies were adequate for current requirements. Breaking stock offerings were short to adequate and demand for additional product ranged fair to good. Light type fowl were fully adequate for normal slaughter schedules.

NORTH ATLANTIC In Boston, prices were unchanged to 2 cents higher on the larger sizes and unchanged to 1 cent higher for mediums. Prices paid to producers in New England were 2 cents higher for smalls and unchanged on all other sizes. In Philadelphia, prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady to at times fully steady entering the weekend. Demand was mostly moderate and best where retail features were planned for the upcoming week. Supplies were generally adequate for full trade requirements. Breaking stock supplies were usually adequate for the fair to good demand. Light type hens were fully adequate for the light to fair demand.

NEW YORK Prices were unchanged on all sizes. The market tone was steady to instances fully steady entering the weekend. Demand was mostly moderate, best where features were planned for next week. Supplies were generally adequate for full trade needs.

MIDWEST Prices to producers in Iowa-Minnesota-Wisconsin were 1 cent higher for all sizes. Prices in other areas were unchanged. Trade sentiment was steady to fully steady. Retail demand was light to moderate, best for feature activity. Food service movement was about moderate. Supplies were mostly adequate. Central States nest run breaking stock mostly prices were unchanged to 1 cent higher with the balance of prices unchanged. Demand was moderate to good as breakers in need bid higher values and see little success in securing product. Many breakers were willing to work from current inventories and shorten breaking schedules. Offerings were barely adequate to short of current requirements. Floor stocks tight to adequate. Schedules mixed. Trade sentiment steady to mostly fully steady.

CHICAGO Prices for all sizes were 1 cent higher. The market tone closed the week steady to fully steady. Retail sales were light to moderate better for features. Food service trade mixed but mostly fair. Supplies were adequate to available for the larger sizes and instances close on the lighter weights.

SOUTHERN Prices were unchanged on all sizes. Asking prices for next week's deliveries were trending higher than present week. The market tone was steady to fully steady entering the weekend. Demand was moderate, best where features were planned for next week. Supplies were mostly adequate for trade needs. Breaking stock demand was fair to good for usually adequate offerings. Light type hens were fully adequate for the light to fair demand.

WEST COAST Prices unchanged. The market tone was firm with asking prices for next week 2-3 cents higher on jumbo, 3 cents higher on extra large through medium. Retailer demand light to mainly moderate. Offerings in fair balance with extra inventory held comfortably where present.

NATIONAL LIQUID EGGS No pasteurized whites reported with pasteurized salt yolk reported from 75 to 78 cents fob, mostly 76 to 78 cents fob. Trade sentiment was firm for whole egg and yolk and barely steady to weak on whites. Offerings of whole egg and yolk were tight to short of current buyer interest. White offerings were adequate or available. Demand was good to very good for yolk and good for whole egg and whites. Asking prices for next week on whole egg and yolk were substantially higher than current quoted values. Breaking stock supplies were tight to adequate with prices higher when compared to last week.

EASTERN REGION FROZEN Mostly prices were unchanged on whites, balance of other items were mostly higher when compared to a week earlier. Offerings were usually short on yolk, close balanced to tight on whole egg and adequate to available on whites. Demand was reported in a range of light to occasionally good. Undertone was barely steady to weak on whites, but fully steady to firm on yolks and whole egg. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending October 13, 2001 were 1% less than the previous week, and 6% less than a year ago.

CENTRAL REGION FROZEN Prices ranged unchanged on frozen whole egg, unchanged to 2 cents lower for whites, unchanged to 6 cents higher for sugared yolk, and unchanged to 1 cent higher for salted yolk. Trade sentiment was steady to fully steady for whole egg, barely steady to weak on whites, and firm for yolk. Offerings were adequate for immediate shipment with freezer stocks reported as balanced to just adequate. Demand was fairly good to good for whole egg and yolk and moderate on whites. Breaking stock supplies were tight to adequate with prices higher when compared to last week.

NATIONAL DRIED EGG Mostly prices were lower on albumen, unchanged on yolks and blends, and unchanged to higher on whole when compared to a week earlier. The undertone was barely steady on albumen, but fully steady on whole and yolks. Offerings were reported as adequate to available on albumen, and in close balance to short on yolk and whole. Demand was fair to occasionally good. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending October 13, 2001 were 10% more than the previous week, and 27% more than the same week a year ago. The overall total dried egg year to date change was 10% less than a year earlier.

SOUTH CENTRAL LIGHT LIVE HEN Trading was too few to report. Demand was moderate at best for fully adequate offerings of spent leg-horn fowl. Finished sales were fair with production schedules adequate for needs. Trade sentiment was about steady.
