NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In Chicago, prices were higher on all sizes. In most other locations, prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady to fully steady entering the weekend. Demand ranged light to good and was best where promotions were planned for next week. Supplies were adequate to available for trade requirements. Breaking stock offerings were tight to unavailable in the Central region but were sufficient in the East. Demand for additional product was fair to moderate. Light type fowl were at least adequate for the light and unaggressive demand.

NORTH ATLANTIC In Boston, prices were unchanged to 2 cents higher on large and unchanged to 1 cent higher on mediums. Prices were unchanged on the remainder of sizes and locations. The market tone was generally steady entering the weekend. Demand ranged light to moderate, best where features provided additional movement. Supplies were adequate to available for current trade needs. Breaking stock offerings were sufficient for the moderate demand. Light type hens were at least adequate for mostly normal processing schedules.

NEW YORK Prices were unchanged on all sizes. The market tone was generally steady entering the weekend. Retail and distributive demand ranged light to moderate, best where features were a factor. Supplies were adequate to available for trade requirements.

MIDWEST Prices to producers in Iowa-Minnesota-Wisconsin were 1 cent higher for large and medium and were unchanged for small. Other reported prices were unchanged. Trade sentiment steady to fully steady. Retail demand was in a full range of light to good, mostly moderate and the best interest was coming from feature activity. Food service movement was mostly moderate. Supplies were usually adequate and in some areas were still being held with confidence in anticipation of extra holiday demand over the next couple weeks. Central States nest run breaking stock and checks and undergrades were all mostly one cent higher. Fair trading and demand for the tight to unavailable offerings. An occasional buyer needing product for immediate orders only or turning away liquid orders. Floor stocks close to adequate. Finished product demand continues moderate to good. Trade sentiment steady to firm.

CHICAGO Prices for all sizes advanced 1 cent. The market tone was steady to firm. Demand into all outlets in a full range light to good, best where features are a factor. Offerings adequate.

SOUTHERN Prices ended the week unchanged. Asking prices for next week's deliveries were trending unchanged from current week. The market tone was steady entering the weekend. Demand was light to moderate, best where features were planned for next week. Supplies were adequate to available for trade needs. Breaking stock demand was moderate but unaggressive for sufficient supplies. Light type hens were at least adequate for mostly normal schedules.

WEST COAST Prices unchanged. The market tone was fully steady to firm with asking prices for next week throughout the region unchanged on jumbo, extra large, and medium, 1 cent higher on large. Retailer demand improved seasonally. Offerings in fair balance.

NATIONAL LIQUID EGGS Pasteurized whites reported at 12 cents fob, pasteurized salt yolk reported from 79.5 to 86 cents fob. Trade sentiment continued firm for whole egg and yolk with whites about steady. Supplies of whole egg and yolk generally unavailable, whites adequate. Demand was good to very good for yolk and whole egg and improved for whites. Some breakers turning away liquid orders due to increased breaking stock costs. Breaking stock supplies were tight with prices higher when compared to last week. Prices paid cents per lb., FOB Plant to 10:00AM Friday 02 November, 2001 non-pasteurized trucklot. For delivery within 14 days.

EASTERN REGION FROZEN Mostly prices were unchanged to higher on yolks and unchanged on the balance of items when compared to last week. Offerings were tight on yolk, adequate to closely balanced on whole egg, about adequate on blends, and at least adequate on whites. Demand was reported as light to moderate for immediate needs. The undertone was firm on yolk, fully steady on whole, generally steady for blends, and about steady for whites. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending October 27, 2001 were 1% more than the previous week, but 5% less than last year.

Trade sentiment was firm for sugar and salt yolk, fully steady for whole egg and about steady for whites. Trading and demand moderate and for nearby needs only. Freezer stocks in close balance as breakers reluctant to inventory product at current price relationships. Breaking stock supplies were tight with prices higher when compared to last week.

NATIONAL DRIED EGG Mostly prices were unchanged to higher on whole, higher on yolks, and unchanged on the balance of items when compared to last week. Trading and demand was fair to instances good. Offerings were tight on yolk, closely balanced on whole, at least adequate on whites, and generally adequate for blends. The undertone was firm on yolks, fully steady on whole, and about steady on whites. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending October 27, 2001 were 3% more than the previous week and 19% more than the same week last year. The overall total dried egg year to date change was 9% less than a year earlier.

SHELL EGGS BROKEN UP 6 PERCENT

Shell eggs broken totaled 164 million dozen during September 2001, up 6 percent from September a year ago.

September 2001 contained 20 weekdays, one holiday and five Saturdays, compared to 21 weekdays, one holiday, and five Saturdays in September 2000.

Data presented in this report were compiled from inspection reports of the Food Safety and Inspection Service. The best available data at time of publication were used.
