



# USDA EGG MARKET NEWS REPORT

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## NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In Chicago, prices were 2 cents lower on all sizes. Elsewhere, prices were unchanged. The market tone ranged steady to weak on unchanged to lower trending levels in major terminal markets. Demand into all outlets was light to good for holiday business. Supplies were mostly adequate to occasionally available. Breaker interest was light and cautious as offerings were usually fully adequate to ample from regular suppliers. Light type hens were adequate to fully adequate with increased processing schedules for next week.

**NORTH ATLANTIC** Prices were unchanged in all locations. The market tone was barely steady to instances weak and adjusting on white eggs. Demand into all channels ranged moderate to at times good. Supplies were generally sufficient for current trade needs. Breaking stock offerings from regular suppliers were fully adequate for the moderate demand. Light type hens were adequate to fully adequate for the light to fair demand.

**NEW YORK** Prices were unchanged following the holiday. The market tone barely steady to weak entering the weekend. Demand was light to moderate better where features were planned for next week. Supplies were fully sufficient at current price levels.

**MIDWEST** Prices to producers in Iowa-Minnesota-Wisconsin on large and medium were two cents lower. Prices in other areas unchanged. Trade sentiment was mostly steady to at times barely steady. Retail demand was good to very good for the holiday weekend. Food service movement was generally moderate. Supplies were mixed, closely balanced to adequate for the larger sized eggs and adequate to instances available for smaller sizes. All central states breaking stock prices were lower. Most breakers not actively seeking breaking stock from outside sources. Additional offerings were fully adequate to ample for the limited demand. Schedules fulltime to overtime for next week as breakers need to reduce heavy supplies of incoming breaking stock. Trade sentiment weak.

**CHICAGO** Prices for all sizes declined 2 cents. The market tone was steady to weak. Retail and food service demand light to moderate and best where features are planned or in progress. Offerings generally adequate.

**SOUTHERN** Prices were unchanged. Asking prices for next week's deliveries were trending lower on all sizes in the Atlanta area, however in Florida prices were unchanged for small and slightly higher on the remaining sizes. Trade sentiment was barely steady entering the weekend. Demand was moderate to instances good. Supplies were usually adequate for needs. Breaking stock demand was moderate and offerings were fully adequate from regular suppliers. Light type hens were adequate to fairly adequate for an unaggressive demand.

**WEST COAST** Prices were unchanged. The market tone was weak throughout the region with asking prices for next week 2 cent lower on all sizes. Retailer demand was good. Offerings in fair balance overall.

**NATIONAL LIQUID** No pasteurized whites reported with pasteurized salt yolk reported from 81.5 to 82 cents fob. Trade sentiment was about steady for whole egg and whites and cautiously steady to barely steady for yolk. Offerings were adequate for the light holiday demand. Most breakers were showing optimism for next week's orders. Breaking stock supplies were fully adequate to ample with prices sharply lower when compared to last week's reported prices.

**NATIONAL DRIED EGG** Mostly prices were higher on whole and yolk and unchanged on the remainder of items when compared to last week. Demand was seasonal with supplies generally sufficient. The undertone was fully steady to firm on whole, steady to fully steady on yolks, and steady for whites and blends. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending November 17, 2001 were 15% lower than the previous week and 9% less than the same week last year. The overall total dried egg year to date change was 8% less than a year earlier.
