Light type hens were at least sufficient for mostly normal schedules.

NORTH ATLANTIC In Boston, prices were unchanged to one cent lower on all sizes. In Philadelphia and New England, all prices were unchanged. The market tone was steadier and testing at present values. Central States breaking stock prices were irregular with checks and undergrades lower. Additional demand for heavy nest runs was light to moderate with offerings usually sufficient although tightening in some locations. Floor stocks fully adequate. Schedules mixed. Trade sentiment steady.

CHICAGO Prices for extra large and large declined 1 cent, mediums dropped 2 cents. The market tone was steady to weak. Retail and food service demand light to moderate, best where limited features were planned or in progress. Offerings adequate.

SOUTHERN Prices were unchanged. Asking prices for next week's deliveries were generally trending lower on all sizes. The market tone was reported as improved and in a steadier position entering the weekend. However, demand was light to moderate. Supplies were adequate to available. Breaking stock demand was light and offerings were fully adequate to ample. Light type fowl were at least adequate for mostly normal processing schedules.
