NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE

Prices ended the week unchanged. The market tone was steady. Demand ranged light to good, best into feature activity planned for next week. Supplies were adequate to available, at times close for present needs. Breaking stock demand was light to moderate for adequate to fully adequate offerings. Light type fowl were sufficient for generally normal processing schedules.

NORTH ATLANTIC Prices remained unchanged. The market tone was generally steady. Demand ranged light to moderate, best where features were in progress or planned for the upcoming week. Supplies were adequate to available for trade requirements. Breaking stock supplies were fully adequate for the fair demand. Light type fowl were adequate for the no better than fair demand. Processing schedules for next week were generally normal.

NEW YORK Prices ended the week unchanged on all sizes. The market tone was steady. Demand was moderate to occasionally good, best for planned promotional activity next week. Supplies were fully adequate for needs.

MIDWEST Prices were unchanged. Trade sentiment was steady to at least steady. Retail demand was moderate to good with planned and on-going features providing some good interest. Food service movement was generally moderate. Supplies were adequate to at times close for the larger sizes which were held with increased confidence as some sellers anticipate better interest next week due to the upcoming Christmas holiday. Central States nest run breaking stock prices were irregular with checks and undergrades unchanged. Offerings were adequate to fully adequate as a few breakers reach out for additional nest runs. Most breakers worked from regular commitments. Demand was light to moderate. Floor stocks balanced to fully adequate. Schedules full-time. Trade sentiment steady.

CHICAGO Prices for all sizes unchanged. The market tone was steady. Retail and food service demand in a full range and best where features are a factor. Supplies adequate.

SOUTHERN Prices ended the week unchanged. Asking prices for next week's deliveries were trending unchanged in Atlanta but lower in Florida. The market tone was steady entering the weekend. Demand continued light to moderate and was best where features were planned for the upcoming week. Supplies were adequate to available for present needs. Breaking stock demand was fair and offerings were fully adequate. Light type fowl were adequate for normal schedules.

WEST COAST Prices unchanged. The market tone was steady with asking prices for next week unchanged on all sizes throughout the region. Retailer demand good with feature activity heavy both planned and in progress. Offerings in good balance.

NATIONAL LIQUID EGGS No pasteurized whites reported, with pasteurized salt yolk reported from 66 to 77.5 cents fob, mostly 66 to 72 cents fob. Trade sentiment barely steady to weak with whites in the weakest position followed closely by yolk. Offerings were about adequate to adequate for whole egg, adequate to fully adequate for whites, and fully adequate to ample for yolk. Demand was moderate to good for whole egg and whites and moderate for yolk. Many buyers were continuing to wait on the market to level before purchasing additional product. Breaking stock supplies were balanced to adequate with prices unchanged when compared to last week's reported prices.

EASTERN REGION FROZEN Mostly prices were lower on whole, unchanged to lower on whites and sugared yolks, and unchanged on the balance of items when compared to previous week's trading. Demand was seasonal and reported as light to moderate for usually adequate offerings. The undertone was generally no better than about steady, except for blends which were generally steady. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending December 01, 2001 were 19% higher than the previous week and 10% more than the same week last year.

CENTRAL REGION FROZEN Frozen mostly values were 1 cent lower for whole egg, unchanged for whites and sugared yolk, and unchanged to 1 cent lower for salt yolk. Trade sentiment was barely steady to weak for whole egg and sugar and salt yolk with yolk products in the weakest position. Frozen whites continued to be rated as steady. Demand was quiet to moderate and centered around immediate seasonal needs. Offerings were adequate. Breaking stock supplies were balanced to fully adequate with prices unchanged when compared to last week.

NATIONAL DRIED EGG Mostly prices were lower on whole, unchanged to slightly higher on albumen, and unchanged on the remainder of items when compared to a week earlier. Trading and demand was seasonal and ranged light to moderate. Supplies were generally adequate for trade needs. The undertone was about steady on whole and yolk, cautiously steady on albumen, and mostly steady on blends. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending December 01, 2001 were 37% higher than the previous week and 17% more than the same week last year. The overall total dried egg year to date change was 8% lower than a year earlier.
