NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In Chicago, prices were unchanged on medium but lower on the heavier sizes. Elsewhere, prices were unchanged. The market tone was mixed but was usually steady entering the weekend. Demand was in a full range of light to good, best where severe winter weather conditions and features were present. Supplies of large and extra large were adequate to available while offerings of medium eggs were adequate to at times barely adequate. Breaking stock supplies were fully sufficient to ample for the light demand. Light type fowl were at least adequate for less than normal slaughter schedules.

Effective January 2, 2002, the Prices to Retailers series covering cartoned eggs delivered into retailers' warehouses or directly to the retail outlet will be adjusted to reflect changes in pricing terms. Previously unidentified changes in some pricing terms were found during a review of current data collection and price reporting procedures. Market News will continue to monitor this egg price series and change prices as dictated by pricing procedures used by the egg industry. The prices reported do not reflect marketing allowances. As adjustments are made in individual reports comprising the Prices to Retailers series, the applicable report will include prices both with and without the adjustments on the day the adjustments are made. All affected reports will be adjusted by January 7.

NORTH ATLANTIC In Boston, prices were unchanged to one cent higher on the larger sizes and unchanged for mediums. In Philadelphia and New England, prices were unchanged. The market tone was generally steady entering the weekend. Demand into all channels was moderate to good. Supplies were short for brown eggs and adequate to available on whites. Breaking stock offerings were ample for the light and unaggressive demand. Light type fowl were at least adequate for the slow to fair demand.

NEW YORK Prices were unchanged on all sizes. The market tone was generally steady entering the weekend. Retail and distributive demand ranged moderate to good, best where winter weather conditions and scattered features were a factor. Supplies were generally adequate.

MIDWEST Prices to producers in Iowa-Minnesota-Wisconsin were down 1 cent for large and were unchanged for medium and small. Trade sentiment was mixed, usually steady. Retail demand was light to moderate with the best interest coming from scattered feature activity. Food service movement was generally moderate. Supplies were adequate to available. Central states breaking stock prices unchanged. Offerings from outside sources were at least fully adequate with most breakers hesitant to absorb additional loads at this call. Demand was light. Floor stocks adequate to ample with schedules full-time for next week. Trade sentiment steady.

CHICAGO Extra large and large prices 1 cent lower, mediums unchanged. Trade sentiment about steady on larger sizes, generally steady on mediums. Retail and food service movement slow to moderate. Scattered feature activity providing some additional interest. Supplies generally adequate to fully adequate on the larger sizes, mediums adequate to instances barely adequate.

SOUTHERN Prices ended the week unchanged. Trade sentiment was generally steady entering the weekend. Demand was moderate to instances good due to severe winter weather. Supplies were mostly sufficient. Breaking stock demand was light and unaggressive for ample supplies. Spent hens were at least adequate for the slow to fair demand.

WEST COAST Prices unchanged. The market tone was barely steady with asking prices for next week 1 cent lower on extra large and large in California, unchanged otherwise. Retailer demand good to cover features, just fair elsewhere. Offerings inside the region balanced, increasing from the Midwest.

NATIONAL LIQUID EGGS Pasteurized salt yolk and pasteurized whites were too few to report. Trade sentiment was barely steady to weak for whole egg and yolk with whites about steady. Demand was somewhat improved as operators head into normal schedules, with movement usually reported as sluggish for spot loads of whole egg and yolk. Demand for whites was mostly moderate. Offerings of whole egg were ample for current needs, with whites adequate and yolk at least fully adequate. Breaking stock supplies adequate to ample with prices ranging unchanged when compared to last week. Prices paid cents per lb., FOB Plant to 10:00AM Friday 04 January, 2002 non-pasteurized trucklot. EASTERN REGION FROZEN Mostly prices were lower on whole egg, unchanged to lower on salt yolks, unchanged to higher on whites, and unchanged on sugared yolks when compared to previous week's trading. Demand was seasonally light for adequate offerings. The undertone was steady although traders were watching further market developments. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending December 29, 2001 were 23% lower than the previous week and 11% lower than the same week last year. CENTRAL REGION FROZEN Frozen mostly prices were unchanged to 1 cent lower for whole egg and sugar and salt yolk, with whites unchanged to 1 cent higher when compared to a week ago. Trade sentiment was mostly steady for all products with a few sellers willing to negotiate slightly lower values for frozen whole egg. Offerings adequate to instances fully adequate. Floor stocks comfortably balanced at most locations. Demand mostly quiet as many end users recover from shorter than normal holiday schedules. NATIONAL DRIED EGG Mostly prices were higher on whole, unchanged to higher on albumen, unchanged on blends, but lower on yolks when compared to a week earlier. Trading and demand was fair but seasonal. Supplies were adequate for trade requirements. The undertone was mixed but usually improved on albumen, and cautious but about steady on balance. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending December 29, 2001 were 23% lower than the previous week, but 43% higher than the same week last year. The overall total dried egg year to date change was 4% lower than a year earlier.
