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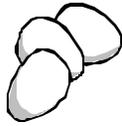

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## NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE

Prices remained unchanged in all locations. The market tone was generally steady entering the holiday weekend. Demand showed signs of improvement in some areas when compared to earlier week trading, but continued in a range of light to mostly moderate. Supplies were adequate to available with the smaller sized eggs in the longest position. Breaking stock offerings were about adequate to adequate for the light to moderate demand. Light type hens were short to sufficient for the light to fair demand. Processing schedules for next week were reported as normal to less than normal.

**NORTH ATLANTIC** Prices were unchanged in all locations. The market tone was generally steady. Demand into all outlets ranged light to moderate. Supplies were adequate to available for current trade needs. Breaking stock offerings were about adequate to adequate for the light to moderate demand. Light type hens were adequate to at least adequate for the light to fair demand. Processing schedules for next week were reported as irregular.

**NEW YORK** Prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady entering the holiday weekend. Demand was light to moderate, best where features were planned or in progress for the upcoming week. Supplies were fully adequate at current levels.

**MIDWEST** Prices in all areas unchanged. Trade sentiment generally steady with larger sizes in the best position. Retail demand was slow to mostly moderate, best where scattered features are in progress. Food service movement was generally moderate. Supplies were adequate on larger sizes, available on smaller sizes. Central states breaking stock prices were unchanged. Offers adequate for the light to moderate demand. Schedules for next week not finalized at this time. Floor stocks adequate to fully adequate. Trade sentiment steady.

**CHICAGO** All prices unchanged. Trade sentiment steady on larger sizes, steady at best on smaller sizes. Retail demand fair at best. Distributive movement generally moderate. Supplies adequate for larger sizes, available for smaller sizes.

**SOUTHERN** Prices were unchanged. The market tone was generally steady. Asking prices for next week were usually trending unchanged on the larger sizes but slightly lower on mediums. Demand improved but was still in a range of light to moderate. Supplies were adequate to available, however packers were showing a tad more confidence on floor stocks. Breaking stock supplies were sufficient for a fair but unaggressive demand. Offerings of light type fowl were irregular but usually adequate as processing schedules were less than normal to normal. Demand was reported as moderate but still unaggressive.

**WEST COAST** Prices unchanged. The market tone was steady with asking prices for next week unchanged on all sizes throughout the region. Retailer demand mainly moderate. Offerings adequate overall.

**NATIONAL LIQUID** Pasteurized salt yolk was too few to report with pasteurized whites reported at 15 cents fob. Trade sentiment steady to mostly fully steady for whites, steady to barely steady for whole egg and barely steady to weak for yolk. Demand was light to moderate at lower trending values for yolk and whole egg and good for whites. Asking prices for next week's deliveries were slightly higher on whites. Offerings fully adequate for yolk and whole egg and tight to short of current demand for whites. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to fully adequate with prices 1 cent higher when compared to last week's reported prices.

**EASTERN REGION FROZEN** Mostly prices were lower on yolks and unchanged on the remainder of items when compared to previous week's trading. Demand was light and unaggressive. Supplies were at least adequate for current trade requirements. The market tone ranged barely steady to weak and trade sentiment was unsettled. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending February 09, 2002 were 5% lower than the previous week, but 10% higher than the same week last year.

Trade sentiment steady to barely steady for all products with yolk in the weakest position. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to fully adequate with prices ranging 1 cent higher when compared to last week's reported prices.

**NATIONAL DRIED EGG** Mostly prices were unchanged on yolks and albumen, unchanged to lower on whole, and higher on blends when compared to a week earlier. Demand was light and unaggressive. Supplies were at least adequate. The undertone was unsettled and ranged barely steady to weak. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending February 09, 2002 were 13% higher than the previous week and 36% more than the same week last year. The overall total dried egg year to date change was 14% higher than a year earlier.

Calculations were adjusted to represent matched plants from current month compared to previous month, and current month compared to previous year. Subsequently, the percent change calculations may be based on different cooperators if directly compared with data on previous reports.  
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
