NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In Chicago, prices were 2 cents lower on mediums and unchanged on the balance. Elsewhere, prices were unchanged. The market tone was generally steady on the larger sizes but barely steady to weak on mediums. Demand ranged light to occasionally good with the best movement centered around promotional activity. Supplies were adequate to ample for current trade requirements. Breaking stock offerings were fully sufficient to mostly ample for the light demand. Light type fowl were fully adequate to ample for processing schedules.

NORTH ATLANTIC Prices were unchanged in all locations. The market tone was generally steady on the larger sizes and barely steady to instances weak on mediums. Demand was light to moderate and slightly better where featured. Supplies were adequate to available for current trade requirements. Breaking stock offerings were usually fully adequate to ample for the light, but active demand. Breaking schedules were less than normal to very heavy. Light type hens were fully adequate to ample. Processing schedules for the upcoming week were reported as normal.

NEW YORK Prices were unchanged on all sizes. Trade sentiment was barely steady to weak on medium and generally steady on the balance of sizes. Demand was light to moderate with the most movement centered around feature activity. Supplies were adequate to ample for current requirements.

MIDWEST Prices to producers in Iowa-Minnesota-Wisconsin were 2 cents lower for medium and were unchanged for the balance. Prices in other reported areas unchanged. Trade sentiment was about steady. Retail demand was usually moderate to at times fairly good in areas where feature activity was a driving factor. Food service movement was mostly moderate. Supplies were fully adequate to available for current needs. Central states breaking stock prices unchanged. Demand was light while offerings of heavy nest runs continued fully adequate to mostly ample. Floor stocks fully adequate to ample. Schedules full-time to over-time to catch up for the lost production time due to the 4th of July holiday. Trade sentiment cautiously steady to barely steady.

CHICAGO Medium prices 2 cents lower, balance unchanged. Trade sentiment steady to barely steady. Retail and distributive demand no better than fair as hot and humid weather continues in the area. Supplies of jumbo's barely adequate, balance of sizes adequate to available.

SOUTHERN Prices were unchanged on all sizes. Asking prices for next week's deliveries were trending lower on mediums but unchanged on the balance. Trade sentiment was barely steady to weak for medium while the larger sizes were in a generally steady position. Demand remained light to moderate, best where features were in progress or planned for the upcoming week. Supplies were adequate to available. Breaking stock demand was light but active for fully adequate to ample offerings. Light type fowl were fully sufficient to ample for an unaggressive demand.

WEST COAST Prices were unchanged. The market tone was barely steady to weak with asking prices for next week unchanged on jumbo and extra large, unchanged to 1 cent lower on large and unchanged to 2 cents lower on smaller sizes. Retailer demand was moderate, best to cover features. Offerings were fully adequate overall.

Retailer demand was fair, best to cover features. Offerings were fully adequate overall. Small benchmark price was 52. Ads in Southern California: major - large dozen 79; smaller outlets - jumbo dozen 79-99, extra large 20 count 169 and 3 for \$5 and medium 20 count 99.

NATIONAL LIQUID Pasteurized salt yolk reported from 78 to 80.5 cents fob with no pasteurized whites reported. Trade sentiment was steady to about steady for all liquid products. Demand was light and spotty although regular commitments, shell egg availability and the holiday interruption had most operators adjusting schedules and working longer hours than previously planned. Offerings adequate or available with whites in the longest position. Yolk had seemed to lose some luster as the week progressed and some suppliers were finding it harder to move available yolk for next week. Breaking stock prices were lower when compared to last week's reported prices. Prices paid cents per lb., FOB Plant to 10:00AM Friday 05 July, 2002 non-pasteurized trucklot. EASTERN REGION FROZEN Mostly prices were unchanged to slightly lower on whole, balance of items were generally unchanged when compared to last week's trading. The market tone was somewhat cautious as traders watch further market developments. Demand was unaggressive due in part to holiday week. Supplies were usually sufficient on most items. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending June 29, 2002 were 3% less than the previous week, but 8% more than a year ago.

CENTRAL REGION FROZEN Frozen whole egg mostly values were 1 cent higher with whites unchanged. Sugared yolk ranged unchanged to 3 cents higher with salt yolk unchanged to 1 cent lower. Trade sentiment was steady for whites and at least steady on the balance of products. Demand was mostly light as processors struggled with irregular shipping schedules due to the 4th of July holiday. Most processors anticipated seasonally regular to brisk business for next week. Breaking stock prices were lower when compared to last week's reported prices.

NATIONAL DRIED EGG REPORT Mostly prices were unchanged when compared to previous week's trading. The market tone was mixed and irregular on light trading. Demand was slow due in part to the holiday week. Supplies were generally tight on yolks and usually adequate to available on other items. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending June 29, 2002 were 14% more than the previous week and 30% higher than the same week last year. The overall total dried egg year to date change was 17% more than a year ago.

EGG PRODUCTS**Shell Eggs Broken Up 6 Percent**

Shell eggs broken totaled 168 million dozen during May 2002, up 6 percent from May a year ago.

May 2002 contained 23 weekdays including one holiday and four Saturdays, the same as May 2001.

During calendar year 2002, shell eggs broken totaled 758 million dozen, up 4 percent from the 730 million dozen broken in 2001. Total edible liquid from eggs broken in 2002 was 969 million pounds, up 4 percent from 2001.
