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NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In the Southeast, weekly prices were slighter higher on the larger sizes and unchanged on mediums. In other areas, prices were slightly higher on the larger sizes and unchanged on mediums. In other areas, prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady entering the week. Demand ranged light to fairly good, best into scattered feature activity. Supplies were adequate to in close balance. Breaking stock offerings were sufficient to tight and demand was moderate to good. Offerings of light type hens were at least adequate to fully adequate for the mostly light to no better than fair demand.

Trade sentiment steady.
