NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



In Chicago, prices were higher on the larger sizes and unchanged on the lighter weight eggs. The market tone steady on medium and fully steady to firm on the larger sizes entering the weekend. Demand light to good, best where features were in progress or planned for next week. Supplies of the lighter weights mixed and ranged barely adequate to ample. However, the larger sizes were closely balanced to tight and continued to be held with confidence. Breaking stock offerings tight to sufficient for the light to good demand. Light type fowl about adequate for the moderate demand. Processing schedules for the upcoming week reported as less than normal to normal.

MIDWEST REGIONAL EGG Prices to producers in IA-MN-WI were 4 cents higher for large. Other reported prices unchanged. Trade sentiment ended the week firm for the larger sizes and steady for the balance. Retail demand moderate to very good in most areas. Food service movement light to moderate as expected for this time of year. Supplies very tight and held with extreme confidence for the larger sizes and usually adequate to ample for mediums. Central states breaking stock prices 1 cent higher. Light trading for the limited offers. Most breakers satisfied with regular commitments. The occasional buyer needing shell eggs bidding higher prices to secure needs. Floor stocks in close balance with many breaking schedules reduced. Trade sentiment fully steady to firm. **RANGE MOSTLY**

Breaking schedules were reduced to mostly normal for next week. Light type fowl were usually about adequate for the moderate demand. Breakers producing product for immediate needs only. Supplies of nest run breaking stock limited with prices unchanged from last week.

Demand and trading was moderate to light for immediate shipment as most traders were not willing to take any long term deliveries. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending November 01, 2003 were 5% less than the previous week, and 8% lower than last year.

NATIONAL DRIED EGG REPORT Majority prices were higher on blends, unchanged to higher on albumen and whole, but unchanged to lower on yolks when compared to a week earlier. The market tone was fully steady to firm on albumen and whole, and improved on yolks. Albumen offerings remain short with less than trucklot trading noted at 6 dollars. Supplies of whole were barely adequate for immediate needs, and yolks were generally sufficient. Dried eggs processed under federal inspection for the week ending November 01, 2003 were 10% less than the previous week, and 6% less than last year. The total year to date dried egg produced was 17% lower than a year earlier.

EGG PRODUCTS**Shell Eggs Broken Up 1 Percent**

Shell eggs broken totaled 160 million dozen during September 2003, up 1 percent from September a year ago.

September 2003 contained 22 weekdays including 1 holiday, and four Saturdays, compared to 21 weekdays including 1 holiday and four Saturdays in September 2002.

During calendar year 2003, shell eggs broken totaled 1.36 billion dozen, down 4 percent from the 1.41 billion dozen broken in 2002. Total edible liquid from eggs broken in 2003 was 1.74 billion pounds, down 3 percent from 2002.
