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

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

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The statistics on sales and markets in this review were compiled from reports and records of auction sales from the State Departments of Agriculture of Kentucky, Tennessee, North Carolina, Virginia, and West Virginia; from data furnished by marketing recorders employed through the offices of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS); and from information received directly from markets and trade sources. The statistics on prices by grades were based on the compilation of auction data recorded from warehouse sales tickets from representative markets in the burley area.

Review of the 1983/84 Marketing Season

Volume of the 1983 burley tobacco crop was down by almost 282 million pounds from 1982 and was the lightest since 1979. A severe drought was experienced during the growing season which curtailed production. Quality was not as good as last season and most grade averages slipped from levels set the previous year. Tobacco displayed properly in sheets, bales, or tied carried a support price this year. The percentage of sales placed under loan was the highest ever for this area.

Gross auction sales and averages. Gross sales totaled 528.7 million pounds averaging \$177.17 per hundred -- down \$3.42 from last season. Producers' sales amounted to 492.2 million pounds averaging \$177.35.

Grade averages. Lower averages were recorded for over 50 percent of the grades, with most losses ranging from \$1 to \$4 per hundred. However, nondescript grades dropped \$8 to \$20. Gains of mainly \$1 to \$2 were noted for about one-fourth of the grades, centering on ripe cutters and leaf. Averages for supported grades ranged from \$195 for B1F to \$120 for N2G. Tobacco classified as NOG, which carries no support, averaged \$96 per hundred.

Composition of offerings. The proportion of unripe and immature tobacco increased by around 25 percent from last year and accounted for almost one-third of the volume. From a quality standpoint, the percentage of fair, low, and nondescript increased by about 16 percent while fine and good decreased.

Loan receipts. The Burley Cooperatives accepted 255.6 million pounds, or 51.9 percent, of net sales this year. Last season, 268.6 million pounds, or 34.7 percent, was placed under loan.

Loan rates. The loan level for the 1984 crop is presently set for \$175.10 per hundred, the same as 1983.

Marketing regulations. In 1983 a user fee of 55 cents per hundred pounds was charged for grading services of the Tobacco Division, USDA. Also, the assessment to the grower for the "no-net-cost tobacco account" was raised from one (1) cent per pound in 1982 to 5 cents per pound in 1983. The contribution from burley growers is maintained by the Commodity Credit Corporation. In addition, producers who marketed tobacco ineligible for price support because they did not agree to contribute to the fund were subject to a penalty of 75 percent of the previous year's average market price. The Associations deduction for overhead cost remained at one cent per pound.

1982 carryover sales. The Burley Tobacco Growers Cooperative Association offered about 29.6 million pounds, and the Burley Stabilization Corporation around 3.6 million pounds of 1982 crop carryover for sale on a sealed bid basis in October 1983. This total of approximately 33.2 million pounds counted against the 1983 effective quota. Tables in this review do not reflect these sales.

Preliminary 1984 quota. The 1984 basic quota for burley tobacco is 582 million pounds or about 10 percent below 1983. Allowing for over and under quota marketings of last season, this brings the effective quota to around 697 million pounds.

Type 32, Maryland

There was no federal inspection or market news again on the four auction markets in Maryland during the past marketing season. In a mail referendum held in February 1982, 84 percent of the producers who voted opposed mandatory USDA inspection of their product.

Growers in Maryland had been receiving free mandatory grading and market news services from USDA since 1948.

Under the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981, however, user fees were imposed for auction sales at designated auction markets. Since Maryland, Type 32 tobacco has not been under production quotas or price support since 1965, growers petitioned the Secretary of Agriculture to conduct the referendum allowing them to vote on terminating the designation of the four auction markets : Hughesville, LaPlata, Upper Marlboro, and Waldorf.
