




The statistics on sales and markets in this review were compiled from reports and records of auction sales from the State Departments of Agriculture of Kentucky, Tennessee, North Carolina, Virginia and West Virginia; from data furnished by marketing recorders employed through the offices of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS); and from information received directly from markets and trade sources. The statistics on prices by grades were based on the compilation of auction data recorded from warehouse sales tickets from representative markets in the burley area.

Review of the 1990/91 Marketing Season

THE 1990 CROP of Burley tobacco was in strong demand by the buying companies. Prior to the Christmas break practically all marketings sold for \$174 per hundred, with \$177 paid afterward. With the exception of an increase in mixed stripped tobacco, composition of marketings showed little change from last season. NO TOBACCO WENT UNDER THE LOAN PROGRAM THIS SEASON. Auctions began November 19 and ran through February 21 with a total of 40 sales days. There were 56 sets of buyers again this year.

GROSS SALES at auction this season totaled 657.3 million pounds, bringing \$1,151.4 million averaging \$175.19 per hundred. Producers' sales at auction totaled 507.5 million pounds averaging \$175.18. Producers also sold 54.6 million pounds direct from the farm as recorded on ASCS Form MQ-79 and an additional 30.4 million pounds to warehouses as recorded on ASCS Form MQ-80 giving a total of 592.4 million pounds of producer marketings during the 1990-91 season.

AVERAGES IMPROVED for all grades this season with very little spread in prices for various marketings. Gains ranged from \$7 to \$9 in most cases, but were even higher for most nondescript. Top average recorded was \$177 for B1FR and the lowest was \$172 for grade N2G.

OVERALL QUALITY showed only minor differences from last season. The volume of mixed (M)

grades continued to rise totaling 23 percent. Colorwise, the percentage of tan rose 8 points making up just over half of all marketings with a similar decline in red and tannish red.

MARKETING CHARGES remained the same for the 1990 crop. A No Net Cost fee of 2 cents per pound was shared equally between producers and purchasers and the grading fee was 67 cents per hundred or .0067 cents per pound. Both of these fees are subject to change for the 1991 crop.

LOAN LEVEL AND 1991 QUOTA. The basic quota for the 1991 crop is 726 million pounds, up 123.7 million pounds from 1990. The effective quota is expected to be about 875 million pounds or 134 million above 1990. The support level of \$158.40 for the 1991 crop is up \$2.60 from last season.

MAJOR LEGISLATIVE changes have been made for the 1991 season. With some restrictions, the sale of burley tobacco quota within counties is permitted with the 1991 crop year. Quota holders will be required to lease, or attempt to grow their quota 2 out of 3 years instead of 1 out of 5 years. Quota not produced will be forfeited. In Tennessee, lease and transfer across county lines is authorized. The amount that can be leased is increased from 15,000 to 30,000 pounds. These changes are designed to increase utilization of quota.
