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

# BURLEY TOBACCO AUCTION MARKETS AND PRODUCING AREAS



U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

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The statistics on sales and markets in this review were compiled from reports and records of auction sales from the State Departments of Agriculture of Kentucky, Tennessee, North Carolina, Virginia and West Virginia; from data furnished by marketing recorders employed through the offices of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS); and from information received directly from markets and trade sources. The statistics on prices by grades were based on the compilation of auction data recorded from warehouse sales tickets from representative markets in the burley area.

## Review of the 1993/94 Marketing Season

THE 1993-94 CROP of Burley tobacco saw steady to slightly higher prices, even though the demand was considerably lower. This resulted in the highest loan receipts since the 1983 crop. Volume of sales declined by around 82.0 million pounds due to the reduction in the 1993 quota. Severe weather conditions caused most sales to be suspended for three days during January. Opening sales were held November 22, 1993, and ended March 15, 1994, for a total of fifty days, three less than last year.

GROSS SALES AT AUCTION amounted to 653.8 million pounds, returning \$1,187.1 million averaging \$181.59 per hundred. This was an increase of 11 cents over last season. Producers' sales totaled 626.2 million pounds, and averaged \$181.70 per hundred. Non-auction purchases continued to decline, and amounted to 467,000 pounds this year.

AVERAGES IMPROVED overall for around 40 percent of offerings, declined for about 43 percent, and held steady for the remaining 17 percent. Over 56 percent of upper stalk marketings saw gains of generally \$1 to \$5 per hundred. About 60 percent of lower stalk tobacco lost mostly \$1 to \$4 per hundred, with the exception of green and greenish tobacco, which gained generally \$1 to \$9 per hundred pounds. Losses of \$1 to \$6 per hundred were noted in 75 percent of mixed and nondescript sales. Top average for the 1993 crop was \$187, with the lowest at \$96.

COMPOSITION OF MARKETINGS was similar to last season, except for an increase in tan colored tobacco, and a decrease in mixed colored offerings. Tan colored marketings made up 62 percent of sales, tannish red 22, red 3, mixed 6, greenish 3, and green 2 percent. From a quality standpoint, choice accounted for 1

percent of volume, fine 6, good 28, fair 49, and low 14 percent. Group percentages were as follows: flyings - 6; cutters - 23; leaf - 67; tips - 1; mixed - 2, and nondescript, less than 1 percent.

THE BURLEY COOPERATIVES received 232.2 million pounds, or 37.1 percent of net sales this season, compared with 142.7 million pounds, or 20.4 percent last year. The majority of receipts this year consisted of better quality marketings.

SETS OF BUYERS totaled 56, the same as the previous year. Several markets shared buyers this season.

MARKETING CHARGES increased to 4.5 cents for the 1993 crop. The producer paid 1 cent per pound and the purchaser 3.5 cents. The fee for grading services of the USDA-AMS Tobacco Division remained at 70 cents per hundred pounds.

LOAN LEVEL AND 1994 QUOTA. A loan level of \$171.40 has been announced for the 1994 crop of Burley by the USDA - up 3.1 cents from 1993. The 1994 basic quota is 542.7 million pounds, down 10 percent from 1993. The effective quota is estimated at 613.0 million pounds, or 105 million pounds below last year.

MARKETING DURING THE 1993-94 marketing season was conducted under Policies and Procedures recommended by the Burley Tobacco Advisory Committee and adopted and implemented by the Secretary of Agriculture. The major provisions were (1) a daily belt wide limit of 34 million pounds, and (2) daily sales opportunities per market within the limit of 34 million pounds to include any combination of producer and resale tobacco, but only one half of one percent of non-auction purchased tobacco.
