Acceptances will be announced by midnight, April 21, 2023. Deliveries are to be made between July 1, 2023 and June 30, 2024.

#### **Basis for Offers/Awards**

Offerors are to bid a single fixed price per state/territory for chicken fajita strip product. States/territories will be awarded to a single offeror in accordance with FAR Part 14 Procedures. The award will be made based on the lowest overall cost to the Government given offeror capacity constraints. In the event of capacity constraint limitations, the Government reserves the right to make multiple awards under this solicitation. Successful offerors will be issued monthly delivery orders, 60 days prior to the delivery period, outlining specific delivery information including delivery period, quantity, and delivery location information. Offerors may submit offers for less than the quantities indicated.

This solicitation is 50% Partial Small Business Set Aside. See FAR 52.219-7 Notice of Partial Small Business Set Aside. NAICS Code 311615 with size standard of 1,250 employees and below applies to this solicitation.

This solicitation also has a 10% Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business set aside.

### **Instructions to Offerors**

Offerors who intend to use more than one processing plant and shipping point for contracts awarded under this solicitation, other than the processing plant and shipping point entered in their bids, may submit a list of their approved processing plants and shipping points on a separate sheet of paper to be uploaded in WBSCM, and to be submitted with their bids.

Offerors are cautioned to bid only quantities they can reasonably expect to produce and deliver.

The Government reserves the right to reject, in total or in part, manufacturers lots, sub-lots, production dates or the like when non-conforming product is identified.

All prime vendors are reminded that they are prohibited from subcontracting with companies or individuals that have been suspended or debarred.

To submit offers on this Solicitation, Offerors must be deemed responsive and responsible by the Contracting Officer.

## **52.216-1 Type of Contract (Apr 1984)**

## 52.216-18 Ordering (Aug 2020)

- (a) Any supplies and services to be furnished under this contract shall be ordered by issuance of delivery orders or task orders by the individuals or activities designated in the Schedule. Such orders may be issued from date of award through June 30, 2024.
- (b) All delivery orders or task orders are subject to the terms and conditions of this contract. In the event of conflict between a delivery order or task order and this contract, the contract shall control.
- (c) A delivery order or task order is considered "issued" when-
  - (1) If sent by mail (includes transmittal by U.S. mail or private delivery service), the Government deposits the order in the mail;
  - (2) If sent by fax, the Government transmits the order to the Contractor's fax number; or
  - (3) If sent electronically, the Government either—
    - (i) Posts a copy of the delivery order or task order to a Government document access system, and notice is sent to the Contractor; or
    - (ii) Distributes the delivery order or task order via email to the Contractor's email address.
- (d) Orders may be issued by methods other than those enumerated in this clause only if authorized in the contract.

#### **52.216-19 Order Limitations (Oct 1995)**

- (a) Minimum order. When the Government requires supplies or services covered by this contract in an amount of less than <u>one truckload</u>, the Government is not obligated to purchase, nor is the Contractor obligated to furnish, those supplies or services under the contract.
- (b) Maximum order. The Contractor is not obligated to honor—
  - (1) Any order for a single item in excess of the balance of the contract maximum or Contractor's offered capacity for the applicable delivery period, whichever is less;
  - (2) Any order for a combination of items in excess of items in excess of the balance of the contract maximum or Contractor's offered capacity for the applicable delivery period, whichever is less; or
  - (3) A series of orders from the same ordering office within <u>31</u> days that together call for quantities exceeding the limitation in paragraph (b)(1) or (2) of this section.
- (c) If this is a requirements contract (*i.e.*, includes the Requirements clause at subsection 52.216-21 of the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR)), the Government is not required to order a part of any one requirement from the Contractor if that requirement exceeds the maximum- order limitations in paragraph (b) of this section.
- (d) Notwithstanding paragraphs (b) and (c) of this section, the Contractor shall honor any order exceeding the maximum order limitations in paragraph (b), unless that order (or orders) is returned to the ordering office within 7 days after issuance, with written notice stating the Contractor's intent not to ship the item (or items) called for and the reasons. Upon receiving this notice, the Government may acquire the supplies or services from another source.

## 52.216-22 Indefinite Quantity (Oct 1995)

- (a) This is an indefinite-quantity contract for the supplies or services specified, and effective for the period stated, in the Schedule. The quantities of supplies and services specified in the Schedule are estimates only and are not purchased by this contract.
- (b) Delivery or performance shall be made only as authorized by orders issued in accordance with the Ordering clause. The Contractor shall furnish to the Government, when and if ordered, the supplies or services specified in the Schedule up to and including the quantity designated in the Schedule as the "maximum." The Government shall order at least the quantity of supplies or services designated in the Schedule as the "minimum."
- (c) Except for any limitations on quantities in the Order Limitations clause or in the Schedule, there is no limit on the number of orders that may be issued. The Government may issue orders requiring delivery to multiple destinations or performance at multiple locations.
- (d) Any order issued during the effective period of this contract and not completed within that period shall be completed by the Contractor within the time specified in the order. The contract shall govern the Contractor's and Government's rights and obligations with respect to that order to the same extent as if the order were completed during the contract's effective period; *provided*, that the Contractor shall not be required to make any deliveries under this contract 60 days after the through date in clause 452.211-74.

#### 52.216-27 Single or Multiple Awards (Oct 1995)

The Government may elect to award a single delivery order contract or task order contract or to award multiple delivery order contracts or task order contracts for the same or similar supplies or services to two or more sources under this solicitation.

## 452.216-72 Evaluation Quantities - Indefinite-Delivery Contract (Feb 1988)

To evaluate offers for award purposes, AMS will apply a strategic algorithm that considers price, delivery constraints, and socio-economic factors (set asides) across all materials and plants for each vendor utilizing State pricing submitted from each offeror against the Estimated Yearly Quantity based on current orders.
