The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) invites offers to sell Mozzarella Cheese Products pursuant to the AMS Master Solicitation for use in the domestic food distribution programs. Bids are due by 1pm CST on 3 January 2025. Acceptances will be announced by 5pm CST on 13 January 2025. Deliveries are to be made between 16 February 2025 - 31 March 2025.

This solicitation may show multiple stops on some line items; however, the number of stops will be limited to a maximum of three. To determine the number of destinations, review the "Tendering Text" for the lot, which will indicate the city and state for each stop. Bidders may submit different prices for each stop. However, a price is required on all line items within the lot. For offshore destinations (Puerto Rico, Hawaii, etc.), offerors have the option to choose to enter their bids direct to the offshore destination or to the port. Purchases will be made on an f.o.b. destination basis to cities on this solicitation. Destination quantities listed are estimates and subject to adjustment based on offerings, changes in recipient needs, market conditions, and program operations.

All prime vendors are reminded that they are prohibited from subcontracting with companies or individuals that have been suspended or debarred.

The government has modified its acquisition strategy for Mozzarella Cheese in response to changing requirements. Recipients of bulk processor packs of mozzarella cheese have definite requirements as to the use, or lack thereof, of the antimycotic Natamycin during production. In place of the previous IDIQ vehicle with a one-year period of performance, the government instead expects to solicit via series of Invitation for Bids (IFB) resulting in definite firm-fixed-price contracts. Three separate solicitations will be offered each round: one for bulk processor packs of mozzarella that contain Natamycin, one for bulk processor packs of mozzarella that do NOT contain Natamycin and one for other mozzarella cheese products. The government will continue to solicit for bulk processor packs using established codes that differentiate a requirement for wrapped or unwrapped product: 110244 Chilled Bulk Processor Pack (LMPS) and 111791 Chilled Bulk Wrapped Processor Pack (LMPS). The solicitation for other mozzarella cheese products does not have a definite requirement for Natamycin. There will NOT be an Economic Price Adjustment (EPA) with this solicitation.

This Solicitation (SOLICITATION 12-3J14-25-B-0101 WBSCM NO: 2000010492) specifically invites offers for **Bulk Processor Packs of Mozzarella Cheese with Natamycin.**

USDA invites all potentially interested parties to attend a Pre-Solicitation Conference. Conference to be held virtually via Zoom on Tuesday 12/10/2024 from 1300-1500 CST. Additional information, to include registration information and an access link, will be distributed via subsequent announcement on GovDelivery.

Products delivered under contracts awarded from this solicitation must be manufactured in a plant approved by USDA/Dairy Programs with the code C17. Products may be processed under code C52 or P11. Products processed under code P11 must originate from a plant with a C17 code. Plant

approvals must be listed on the Dairy Programs website (https://apps.ams.usda.gov/dairy/ApprovedPlantList/), or documentation of the approval must be submitted as an attachment to your bid.

This Acquisition has up to 30% Small Business Set-Aside and Hub Zone preference.

This solicitation is being executed via Invitation for Bids (IFB) with intention to result in a Firm-Fixed Price (FFP) contract award.

The below changes are made to the USDA Commodity Requirements Document for Mozzarella Cheese, August 2024.

Part 1, Section 1.1, E. Microbiological Requirements:

E. Coli shall be required to be <10 MPN/gram.

L. monocytogenes shall be Negative in a 25-gram sample.
