COLONY, HONEY PLANT AND MARKET CONDITIONS DURING APRIL 2024

APPALACHIAN DISTRICT (MD, PA, VA, WV): April had plenty of rainy days mixed with warm weather and cold weather – enough of these “false springs” and made everyone wonder when the actual spring arrived. On the 29th of the month a new record high was set at Thurgood Marshall (BWI) airport at 92 degrees and the previous day (Saturday) was blustery and cold in the mid-fifties. A few beekeepers reported some colony losses from the winter and some were reporting queenless colonies. There was a lot of activity in the search for replacement queens, which were readily available locally. Colonies had been very busy with brood rearing despite the roller coaster weather and the result was swarming. This kept beekeepers busy setting traps and gathering displaced bees. Several colonies were moved into orchards for pollination. Readily available and prolific early sources of pollen and nectar

included peaches, nectarines, willow, redbud, cherry, dandelion, and strawberries followed by blueberries, Russian olive, wisteria, serviceberry, apples, wild mustard, various wildflowers and the start of black locust and tulip poplar in the southern part of the Appalachian District.

ALABAMA: During most of the month of April, Alabama experienced usual temperatures and levels of precipitation; temperatures crept up slightly at the end of the month, with abnormally dry conditions reported in the far northeast part of the state. Some beekeepers in southern Alabama believed some periods of heavy rain and high wind slowed their nectar flow. Beekeepers and members of the public throughout the state reported swarming, which was expected due to the availability of forage from plants such as clover, privet, tupelo, and persimmon. Many beekeepers received and hived packages during the month of April, and installed honey supers in anticipation of heavy nectar flows. Some beekeepers also monitored for varroa mites, and even applied honey-super friendly treatments when levels were above treatment threshold.

ARIZONA: No report issued.

ARKANSAS: During the month of April temperatures were very high across most of the state. Precipitation was slightly below normal across most of the same area. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, most of the state had normal soil moisture. There is a line along the northern border of abnormally dry conditions.

Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

CALIFORNIA: No report issued.

FLORIDA: Temperatures were about normal with below normal precipitation in most areas except the Panhandle and North Florida. Bee health and numbers were considered to be good. Growing conditions for gallberry and tupelo honey production was nearly perfect. Tupelo honey production may be the best in the past five years and gallberry was good too. Some gallberry honey was pulled before the end of the month but most of the tupelo was expected to be pulled around the end of the month or early May. Bees were also pollinating watermelons in north Florida while others were being prepared for shipment to northern states for pollinating a variety of crops in May. Bees finished returning from California during the month and their bee health was considered to be good with few problems reported. South Florida did have enough moisture to get good flows from gallberry, palmetto, Spanish Needle and mangrove. The flow from these sources appeared to be the best in the last two or three years. April honey production in Florida was good or very good in almost all of Florida. There was good demand for honey with fairly light stored stocks at the end of the month.

GEORGIA: Beekeepers are working on the hives, replacing some and adding new ones to collect more honey. The bees are reported to be in good condition and losses are average. A good honey flow is expected through August if weather allows, and beekeepers are busy preparing the hives while the weather permits it. Honey flow is expected to be average or good. Sales are reported to be steady and good but not as busy as some would prefer. Many people are buying the local honey for allergies, and it is keeping the volume down for now. Prices are holding steady but some have been sold at lower prices earlier. Sourwood \$4 a pound in the barrel Wildflower \$2.75 a pound in the barrel

IDAHO, COLORADO, UTAH: During the month of April temperatures were average in Idaho. Precipitation in Idaho was above normal. Utah had temperatures that were average and precipitation that was normal. Colorado had average temperatures across the whole state, Precipitation for Colorado was above normal for April.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in April Southern Idaho had no drought and Northern Idaho had moderate to severe drought. Utah is currently under no drought to abnormally dry conditions in Southeast Utah. Colorado had normal soil moisture to moderate drought in Southwestern Colorado.

Some producers have moved their hives home from California almond pollination.

Prices for the month of April were between \$2.20 and \$3.20 per pound with a mostly price of \$2.20-2.85 for Idaho, Colorado prices are too few producers reporting to determine a market. Prices for locally sourced honey in Utah are \$2.50-\$3.30 per pound with mostly \$3.00 to \$3.30.

ILLINOIS: Temperatures for the month of April were slightly warmer than average with a little more rainfall than average. Beekeepers report that their bees are in good condition. Beekeepers report that the following foliage is in bloom: Pussy willow, soft maple as sources of pollen; and maples, and a little dandelion for nectar. Demand for honey is very good at the retail level and good at wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

INDIANA: Temperatures for the month of April were good overall and slightly warmer than average for the month. Rainfall was almost double for this time of the year. Beekeepers report that maple and willow are in bloom. Most beekeepers report their bees are in good condition, while some are rebuilding. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

IOWA, KANSAS, MISSOURI, NEBRASKA: No report issued.

KENTUCKY: Kentucky beekeepers managed to avoid any snow in April, which tends to slow hives down in the middle of spring buildup and create havoc for those beekeepers wanting to make splits and/or start queens. Many beekeepers have successfully reared their own queens or been able to make splits. Swarms have been prolific throughout the state. There have been reports of European foulbrood in the central part of the state, but diagnostic kits for European foulbrood have been difficult to find from bee supply providers. Black locust and tulip poplar, two of Kentucky's most reliable blooms, started providing nectar by the end of the month, heralds for a productive honey season later in the summer.

LOUISIANA: During the month of April temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was about normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, normal soil moisture conditions exist across most of the state.

Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

MICHIGAN: April ended up being cool, wet and windy in Michigan's Upper Peninsula this year. A few warm days scattered throughout the month that usually were accompanied by strong winds. It was a terrible month for those of us with tree pollen allergies and an excellent month for our bees with the almost limitless supply from the early budding trees. Dealing with dead-outs, prepping equipment and anxiously waiting for our newly ordered bees have kept us busy. The bears are out now in force and testing fences for weakness. Speaking from experience, the hungry spring bears are the most

persistent and troublesome. Hopefully we will get a quick green up and they will have other forage to fill up on. Wildflower honey retails for \$9.00 pound.

MINNESOTA: During the month of April temperatures were average across the whole state. Precipitation for April was normal for the North end of the state, the South end of the state saw above normal precipitation.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in April, Northern Minnesota had abnormally dry to severe drought soil moisture and Southern Minnesota had no drought to abnormally dry conditions in Southeast Minnesota.

Some producers have moved their hives home from California almond pollination.

Prices per pound in Minnesota were \$2.80-\$3.00 with mostly price of \$2.80-\$3.00 for locally sourced honey for the month of April.

MISSISSIPPI: Beekeepers are taking full advantage of the good weather and rebuilding the hives and putting out new ones. Sales are reported to be doing well and prices are holding steady.

MONTANA: No report issued.

NEW ENGLAND: No report issued.

NEW YORK: Warmer than average temperatures with occasional frosts in New York, resulting in some plant damage. Colonies are in place for pollination in fruit orchards. Statewide there was good winter survival with strong hives and much brooding. The first wave of purchased bee packages and nucleus colonies have entered the state. Swarms have commenced in many areas. Demand for honey continues to be strong.

NORTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

NORTH & SOUTH DAKOTA: April saw adequate to good moisture in the soil and pastures. Plantings were generally moving ahead with most crop about average to some well ahead of their average planting dates. Bees were moved according to need, with some going to the Pacific Northwest to aid with the tree fruit crops. Some hives began to make their way home.

OHIO: Ohio had above normal temperature during April. Trees bloomed early by about three weeks. Which gave honeybees early pollen and nectar giving an early buildup of managed bees plus feral bees. April rain fall was above normal plus Ohio had several severe thunderstorms during April. High winds above 40 MPH were typical. Pollen counts were extremely high, people with pollen allergies had major symptoms. All pollinator flowers were early, invasive flowers in farm fields were providing both pollen and nectar early. However because of the early spring food for bees, swarming started early this year. The typical swarms that occur in May occurred in April. This year's feral swarms are much larger than in the past, some swarms were about 10 pounds. Beekeepers are receiving early honey flows also. Honey prices have remained stable at \$5.50 - \$6.00 per pound wholesale and \$9.00 - \$16.99 Retail.

Along with the high winds, most of Ohio received snow and rain. Cleveland received 10 inches of snow within a few days along with 3 inches of rain. Temperatures ranged from 75 F early in the month to 23 degrees toward the end of the month. Both Columbus and Cincinnati experienced similar temperature ranges, however Central Ohio received 4 inches of snow and 3.62 inches of rain. Although no snow reached Cincinnati, it received 4.16" of rain. Growing degree days are around 158 in Central Ohio with the saucer magnolia and Sargent Cherry in first bloom. In Cincinnati, the Spring Snow crabapple, Manchu cherry and serviceberry are in first bloom. The cornelian-cherry dogwood and Manchu cherry are in first bloom in the Cleveland area. Beekeepers are reporting multiple colored pollen being brought in. Drones have emerged and are flying into colonies.

OKLAHOMA: During the month of April temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was about normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, northern Oklahoma had abnormally dry to moderate drought conditions. The southern part of the state had normal to scattered areas of abnormally dry conditions.

Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

OREGON: No report issued.

SOUTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

TENNESSEE: Tennessee Honeybee colonies across the state are healthy, building up quickly and producing above average honey stores this spring. April nectar and pollen sources have included Black Locust, Tulip Poplar, Blackberry, Raspberry, Fruit trees, dandelion, crimson clover, Dutch clover and wildflowers. There were no major pest or disease issues reported in April across the State. There have been a few isolated cases of European Foulbrood reported and confirmed in West Tennessee. Honey prices across the state range from \$10 to \$16 per pound at Farmer's Markets and at beekeeper's Honey Stands.

TEXAS: During the month of April temperatures were above normal across most of the state. Precipitation during was above normal across most of the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, East, North central, and the Panhandle had normal soil moisture. Abnormally dry to severe drought conditions covered the area from South to far West Texas with an area of extreme drought still in an area West of San Antonio.

Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

WASHINGTON: April began with many crops slightly ahead of schedule. While the snowpack in the mountains is still lower than normal, there was some rain at lower elevations. As the month progressed the asparagus harvest began and the fruit trees began the procession of blooms. Pears and plums were active, Apricots, were winding down. Peach blossom was mixed. Cherry bloom began along with a few apples in the earlier districts. By mid-April some cool nights caused concern and frost protection in many areas of Central Washington. As the month progressed the cherry bloom was winding up while the apples were in full bloom. Slightly warmer, drier aided bees in their

work. Cooler weather mixed with some rain finished out the month as most of the fruit bloom was winding down. Despite some more snowfall in the mountains, it was announced that there would likely be irrigation shortages for some junior rights users later in the season.

WISCONSIN: Temperatures for the month of April were cooler than normal with some very windy days and with an average amount of rain. Most Beekeepers report a normal, healthy population of bees, while others say they are starting over with new packages. Beekeepers report wild foliage for their bees includes Scilla, willows, daffodils and maples. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.
