IRS DIRECTOR NAMED

Washington -- James J. Casimir is the new director of the facilities and information management support division of the Internal Revenue Service.

He is responsible for developing, directing, and coordinating policies and programs for the Servicewide non-ADP support budget, records management, space and property, physical security, resources management information systems, and publishing services.

Casimir began his IRS career in 1961 as an office auditor in the Omaha (Neb.) District where he then became an internal revenue agent. He transferred to Los Angeles in 1967 where he held management positions in various examination functions in the western United States

In 1977 Casimir became the assistant regional commissioner for employee plans and exempt organizations in the IRS Mid- Atlantic Region in Philadelphia. He became assistant regional commissioner for appellate in 1978 and regional director of appeals in 1979.

Casimir completed the IRS Executive Selection and Development Program in 1981. In 1983 he was appointed assistant director of the San Francisco District. Casimir became national director of appeals in 1988, the position he held until his current assignment.

A native of Escanaba, Mich., Casimir earned a bachelor's degree in accounting from St. Mary's College in Winona, Minn., and a master's degree in public administration at Golden Gate University in San Francisco.
