## Federal Advisory Committee Act (FACA)

### Designated Federal Officer (DFO)

#### Roles and Responsibilities

- > Ensure compliance with FACA, and any other applicable laws and regulations
- > Call, attend, and adjourn committee meetings
- > Approve agendas
- ➤ Maintain required records on costs and membership
- > Ensure efficient operations
- > Maintain records for availability to the public
- > Comply with reporting mandates via the USDA Committee Management Officer



# Fruit and Vegetable Industry Advisory Committee (FVIAC)

Function of advisory committee





#### Solely for advisory functions

- Unless otherwise specifically provided by statute or Presidential directive, advisory committees shall be utilized solely for advisory functions.
- Determination of action to be taken and policy to be adopted shall be made solely by the President of an officer of the Federal Government.

#### What can an advisory committee do?

• Provide recommendations and report to the appropriate federal officer on matters within the committee's scope of duties and objectives.



#### **FVIAC Scope**

- 1. Evaluate USDA programs and services.
- 2. Provide recommendations on ways to improve USDA programs and services.

#### **FVIAC Operations**

- Each advisory committee meeting is OPEN to the public.
- Timely notice for each meeting shall be published in the Federal Register at least 15 calendar days prior to the meeting.
- Each meeting must be held at a reasonable time and in a manner or place reasonable accessible to the public.
- Oral/Written comments before committee allowed within FVIAC guidelines.



#### **FVIAC Subcommittees**

- a) Smaller group/division/body created by an advisory committee.
- b) Role generally, presents research, analysis, preliminary conclusion to the committee.
- c) Rules re: open meetings and public access to records DO NOT APPLY to subcommittee meetings and records.
- d) Reports/analysis/deliberation reached by the subcommittee must be presented to the committee as a whole for final substantive review and approval.



#### **Other Operational Questions**

#### Questions/disputes over committee operation and meeting procedures

DFO sets the rules.

DFO approves or calls the meeting of the committee and subcommittee(s).

#### Questions/disputes over scope of authority and duties of the committee

Statute/Charter sets for the authority for the committee.

The agency - via DFO - interprets the scope of authority and duty of the committee.

#### Proprietary information provided/shared

Information "made available to," or "prepared for or by" the committee shall be made available to the public unless 5 U.S.C. 552 applies.

The agency makes the determination whether to invoke exemptions under 5 U.S.C. 552 to withhold information.



#### Representation of the Committee & Agency

- Advisory committees serve solely an advisory role to make recommendation to the executive branch and adoption of any recommendations/reports.
- ➤ Advisory committees MAKE NO POLICY DECISIONS.
- Therefore, a committee does NOT speak for or act on behalf of the agency or designated federal officer.
- ➤ Individual committee members should be careful to ensure their personal statements are not attributed to the position of the Committee as or the Agency.
