
# Overview of Local Food Purchase Assistance Program (LFPA)

- The Local Food Purchase Assistance program maintains and improves food and agricultural supply chain resiliency through non-competitive cooperative agreements to State and Federally Recognized Tribal Governments
- States and Tribal Governments will enter into non-competitive cooperative agreements with USDA for the purchase of local domestic food targeting socially disadvantaged farmers and ranchers to be distributed targeting underserved communities
- Authorized and funded for up to \$400 million under the American Rescue Plan Act

# Three Overarching Goals



Provide an opportunity for States and Tribal Governments to strengthen their local and regional food system.



Help to support local and underserved farmers/producers through building and expanding economic opportunities.



Establish, strengthen, and broaden partnerships with producers and the food distribution community, local food networks, and non-profits- distributing fresh and nutritious foods in rural, remote, or underserved communities.



## How it works

#### **Procurement**

 State and Tribal Governments will procure domestic, local foods from local farmers, ranchers, and fishermen

 Targeted purchases from underserved farmers, ranchers, and fishermen to expand existing local food networks

### **Distribution**

 State and Tribal Governments will distribute the food within their State or region targeting underserved communities

## Who is eligible for this program?

- State agencies, commissions, or departments that are responsible for agriculture, procurement, food distribution, emergency response or similar activities within the State
- Federally recognized Tribal Governments
- One award per State or territory; agencies within the State must coordinate if more than one agency wishes to implement this program

## **Applications Received for LFPA**

- 84 total applications
  - States plus District of Columbia: 50
  - Territories: 3
  - Tribal governments: 31

# Additional Funding Announced Under "LFPA Plus"

- States, territories, and tribal governments may request additional funding under LFPA Plus
  - Details of additional funding announced on November 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2022 (<u>link</u>)
  - \$464 million is available from funds authorized by the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC)
    - Up to \$364 million available for states and territories
    - Up to \$100 million available for tribal governments
  - Allows recipients to amend their current LFPA agreements with additional funding and extend the period of performance by one year
  - Allows new states, tribal Governments and territories who had not previously applied to participate in LFPA

## LFPA Plus - Allowable Costs

 Funding for LFPA Plus is authorized by the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC)


### Allowable costs:

- Food purchases unprocessed or minimally processed foods
- Storage and distribution directly related to the purchase of LFPA food

#### Unallowable costs:

- Administrative expenses (salaries, program development, outreach, technical assistance)
- Indirect costs
- Equipment purchases; capital investment (repair or upgrade)
- Construction costs; production costs (seed, fertilizer, etc)
