



## Disease Free Certification Statements for Israel

The U.S. Department of Agriculture, Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS),  
Veterinary Services (VS) certifies that:

1. Based upon information provided by the applicant, the shell eggs covered by this certificate originated from layer flock(s) located in the following County(ies), State(s):


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2. The eggs were produced and packed in a zone which meets the requirements to be considered free from notifiable avian influenza (NAI) according to the World Organization for Animal Health (WOAH) Terrestrial Animal Health Code Chapter 10.4 (2021) for at least the past 28 days.
3. The eggs were obtained from poultry which:
  - a. Have been held in the country since hatching or have been imported as day-old chicks;
  - b. Come from holdings which have not been placed under animal health restrictions in connection with poultry diseases as recognized by the government of the United States and around which, within a 10km radius, there have been no outbreaks of NAI for at least 28 days and Newcastle disease for at least 90 days in poultry, as all are defined according to the WOA.
4. The laying flocks from which the eggs were derived:
  - a. Participate in the official Salmonella control program overseen by the competent authority. The certifying authority ensures only eggs from participating flocks yielding negative test results prior to shipment are eligible for export.
  - b. Have not been in contact during the 90 days preceding egg collection with poultry which do not fulfill the requirements listed in 4(a).

5. The eggs described above:
- a. Come from establishments which, at the time of packaging, were not under restrictions due to a suspect or actual outbreak of NAI or Newcastle disease and around which, within a radius of 10km, there have been no commercial poultry outbreaks of NAI for the past 28 days and Newcastle disease for the past 90 days.
  - b. Have not been in contact with eggs which do not fulfill the requirements listed in 5(a).
  - c. Meet U.S. standards and regulations for residues, which assures that the products do not contain harmful levels of veterinary drugs, pesticides or environmental contaminants.
  - d. Are labeled in accordance with the “Export Procedures Shell Eggs to Israel (11/1/2023)
  - e. Are transported in new packaging materials and containers, in such condition that the health status of the eggs will not be jeopardized during the transport from their place of origin.
