GENERAL NOTES

- 1. Total reflects appeals closed in FY 2017 regardless of when cases were initiated.
- 2. Not all settlement agreements include civil penalties and not all civil penalties were levied via settlement agreements.
- 3. Total reflects the amount of penalties initially levied. Amounts may change during negotiation of settlements and individual penalty payments may be outstanding.
- 4. On July 20, 2017, a USDA Administrative Law Judge issued a Consent Decision and Order under which Xochitl, a formerly-certified organic corn chip manufacturer in Irving, Texas, agreed to a two-year suspension of its certification. The Decision and Order upheld a September 2015 USDA ALJ Decision that originally included a \$1,826,000 civil penalty. Xochitl will be permitted to seek reinstatement of its certification after one year, and required to pay only \$475,000 of the penalty, if it complies with the USDA organic regulations during the first year of suspension. Xochitl may not sell products as organic while the suspension is in place. Access organic enforcement to learn more.
