Introducing the Training Program

- USDA ORGANIC
- Video-based "choose your own adventure" training – publically available on the web
- Length: Approximately 1 hour total
- Follows an organic inspector through an annual inspection with an organic farmer
- Teaches sound and sensible inspection principles in a practical and engaging way
- Shows what happens when the inspectors makes the right choices and what happens when a better choice could have been made




- Conducting an Opening Meeting

- Ask trainees to list all the issues they observed, along with regulatory citations and possible next steps
