Certifier Evaluation & Verification Responsibilities



7 CFR § 205.402(a)(2) and § 205.403(c) require certifiers to ...

- ✓ Evaluate each client's application materials for compliance
- ✓ Verify during the onsite inspection whether the information in the organic system plan accurately reflects the practices used by the operation

Organic System Plan Requirements



7 CFR § 205.201(a)

An organic system plan (OSP) must include ...

 A description of practices and procedures to be performed and maintained ...

Does the OSP disclose whether the operation exports its products under an international trade arrangement?

Does the OSP include the operation's procedures for verifying source and certification of ingredients imported under an international trade arrangement?

Organic System Plan Requirements (cont.)



An organic system plan (OSP) must include ...

 A list of each substance to be used as a handling input, indicating its composition and source

Does the OSP identify ingredients imported under a trade arrangement, including the source of those ingredients?

Organic System Plan Requirements (cont.)



An organic system plan (OSP) must include ...

 A description of the recordkeeping system implemented to comply with the requirements established in §205.103;

Does the OSP describe records the operation maintains for product imported/exported under a trade arrangement?

Organic System Plan Requirements (cont.)



An organic system plan (OSP) must include ...

 Additional information deemed necessary by the certifying agent to evaluate compliance with the regulations

Does the OSP include information (i.e. documentation) that demonstrates the imported ingredient complies?

Does the OSP include labeling information for product exported under a trade arrangement?

OSP Evaluation & Onsite Verification Process



Does the operation export product?

<u>Does the operation use imported product?</u>

If yes, to/from which country?

Is the product exported/imported under a trade arrangement?

Is the product within the scope of the arrangement?

Does the product meet the terms of the arrangement?

OSP Evaluation & Onsite Verification Process (cont

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For imported/exported product, has the appropriate supporting documentation been provided?



Is the supporting documentation valid?



Does the operation maintain appropriate records for imported/exported product?

For exported product, has the operation provided information about its product labeling practices?



Do the product labeling practices comply with the terms of the arrangement?

Operation Recordkeeping Requirements




7 CFR § 205.103

A certified operation must maintain records that fully disclose all activities and transactions of the certified operation in sufficient detail as to be readily understood and audited. Such records must be available for inspection.

Inspectors should conduct thorough trace-back audits to verify traceability and record-keeping requirements.

Import Recordkeeping Requirements - Equivalency



- **☐** Organic certificate
- **☐ NOP Import Certificate**
 - Not required for Canada
- ☐ Shipment records (ex. Bill of Lading)
- ☐ Purchase records (ex. Purchase order, Invoice)

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Import Documentation Verification - Equivalency



- Organic Certificate should ...
 - attest that the product has been certified to the foreign government's organic regulations
 - be issued by a certifier approved by the foreign government

Import Documentation Verification - Equivalency



- NOP Import Certificate must ...
 - be issued by the final certifier of the product for the specific product, per shipment
 - include the applicable attestation statement
 - Product must meet the scope (i.e. type and point of export) of the equivalency arrangement

Import Documentation Verification - Equivalency



For Canada only, NOP Import Certificates are not required. The appropriate attestation statement issued by the certifier or certified operation may be stated on any documentation (ex. organic certificate, transaction certificate, bill of lading, purchase order)

Exercise 1 – Import Verification



A certified USDA organic handler located in the U.S. plans to use certified organic goji berry imported from Bulgaria under the U.S. – E.U. Equivalency Arrangement. The operator submits an updated organic product profile that correctly indicates the producer of the ingredient and its certifier, along with an organic certificate.

Exercise 1 – Import Verification



Examples of questions certifiers should ask (not limited to):

- 1. Does the product fall within the scope of the arrangement?
- 2. Is this organic certificate valid?
- 3. Is there any additional documentation that needs to be requested and verified?

Import Documentation Requirements - Recognition



- A certified operation using product imported under a recognition agreement must maintain ...
 - ☐ Organic certificate
 - ☐ Transaction Certificate (only India)
 - ☐ Shipment records (ex. Bill of Lading)
 - Purchase records (ex. Purchase order, Invoice)

Import Documentation Verification - Recognition



- Organic Certificate must ...
 - be issued by a certifier approved by the recognized foreign government
 - attest that the product was certified under the USDA organic regulations (NOP technical standards)
 - Product must meet the scope (i.e. type and point of export) of the recognition agreement

Import Documentation Verification – U.S. – India Recognition Agreement




- Organic Certificates must be issued by the certifier from Tracenet (since June 2010)
- A Transaction Certificate issued by the certifier from Tracenet must accompany each shipment (since November 2014)

Export Documentation Verification



- A certified operation exporting product under an international trade arrangement must maintain ...
 - ☐ Applicable export certificate (per shipment)
 - EU: Certificate of Inspection
 - Switzerland: Certificate of Inspection
 - Korea: NAQS Import Certificate
 - Japan: TM-11
 - Taiwan: TM-11

Export Documentation Verification



- During the onsite inspection, inspectors should also verify that ..
 - Export Certificates have been issued by the operation's certifier
 - For Canada, the appropriate attestation statement is being used by the operation, if not issued by the certifier

Labeling Verification – Export



- Certifier and inspector should verify that the operation's labeling practices and product label(s) meet labeling requirements of the foreign country ...
 - Compliant use of any additional organic seals (for Switzerland, no seal)
 - For Japan: who is applying the JAS seal
 - o For Canada: use of dual language
 - o For EU: use of certifier code on the label
 - o For Korea: use of certificate number on the label
