Consignee: One who takes possession of the load, (ie., holding area warehouse, etc.) if other

than the actual user.

User: The feeder or feed dealer if its ground or mixed with other feed stuff.

Note: Prior to making any shipment or in any way disposing of undersized prunes, handlers are required to file a written application on form PMC 2.21 with the Prune Marketing Committee (Committee) for permission to make such shipment or disposal and receive the Committee's approval thereof on form PMC 2.31. Disposal of undersized prunes shall be only in non-human consumption outlets and during the crop year received.
